<p><b>ARIZONA CARDINALS</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li> <p>Made postseason (11-6) for the first time since 2015.</p> <p>Ranked fourth in the league with a +12 turnover differential.</p> <p>Won their first seven road games and became the third team ever to win seven consecutive road games each by at least 10 points within a single season, joining the <b>1984 SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS</b> and <b>1968 DALLAS COWBOYS</b>.</p> </li> <li> <p>QB <b>KYLER MURRAY</b> recorded 3,787 passing yards and 423 rushing yards and became the first player ever with at least 3,500 passing yards and 400 rushing yards in each of his first three seasons.</p> <p>Became the first player ever with at least 70 touchdown passes (70) and 20 rushing touchdowns (20) in his first three seasons.</p> <p>Joined <b>CAM NEWTON</b> (28 rushing touchdowns) and <b>JOSH ALLEN</b> (25) as the only quarterbacks with at least 20 rushing touchdowns in their first three seasons in the Super Bowl era.</p> <p>Has 13 career games with both a passing touchdown and rushing touchdown, tied with <b>DAK PRESCOTT</b> (13 games) for the third-most such games by a quarterback in his first three seasons all-time. Only <b>CAM NEWTON</b> (20 games) and <b>JOSH ALLEN</b> (16) have more.</p> <p>Has five career games with at least three touchdown passes and one rushing touchdown, the most by a quarterback in his first three seasons all-time.</p> <p>Has 11,480 career passing yards and became the fourth-youngest player (24 years, 120 days old) to reach 10,000 passing yards in NFL history, surpassing <b>CAM NEWTON</b> (24 years, 191 days).</p> <p>Joined <b>DREW BREES</b> (2018) and Pro Football Hall of Famer <b>PEYTON MANNING</b> (2013) as the only quarterbacks in NFL history with at least 1,500 passing yards and a completion percentage of 75-or-higher through his team's first five games of a season.</p> <p>Became the first player with at least three touchdown passes and one rushing touchdown in each of his team's first two games of a season in NFL history.</p> </li> <li> <p>WR <b>DEANDRE HOPKINS</b> has 789 career receptions and, at 29 years and 221 days old, surpassed <b>LARRY FITZGERALD</b> (764) for the most receptions ever by a player prior to his 30th birthday.</p> <p>His 789 receptions are the fifth-most ever by a player in his first nine seasons.</p> <p>Had eight touchdown receptions and is one of four players in the league with at least six touchdown receptions in each of the past five seasons.</p> </li> <li> <p>RB <b>JAMES CONNER</b> ranked third in the league with a career-high 18 touchdowns and tied for second with 15 rushing touchdowns, both the second-most ever in a single season in franchise history.</p> </li> <li> <p>LB <b>CHANDLER JONES</b> recorded 10.5 sacks, his seventh-career season with at least 10 sacks, tied for the most among active players.</p> </li> </ul>

	<p>On Kickoff Weekend, became the third player to record at least five sacks in a Week 1 game since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic.</p> <p>On Kickoff Weekend, became the sixth player to record at least five sacks and two forced fumbles in a single game since 2002.</p> <p>Became the fourth player since 1982 with three NFL games of at least four sacks, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers <b>DERRICK THOMAS</b> (four games) and <b>REGGIE WHITE</b> (three), as well as <b>LESLIE O'NEAL</b> (four).</p>
<b>ATLANTA FALCONS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>QB <b>MATT RYAN</b> has 59,735 career passing yards and surpassed <b>ELI MANNING</b> (57,023) for the eighth-most passing yards in NFL history.</li> </ul> <p>Surpassed <b>DREW BREES</b> (56,033) for the most passing yards by a player in his first 14 seasons in league history.</p> <p>Has 367 career touchdown passes and surpassed <b>ELI MANNING</b> (366 touchdown passes) for the ninth-most touchdown passes in NFL history.</p> <p>Surpassed <b>TOM BRADY</b> (359) for the fifth-most touchdown passes by a player in his first 14 seasons in league history.</p> <p>Recorded 3,968 passing yards and became the fifth player ever to record at least 3,500 passing yards in 12 consecutive seasons.</p> <p>Has 73 career games with at least 300 passing yards, tied with <b>PHILIP RIVERS</b> (73) for the fourth-most such games all-time.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>TE <b>KYLE PITTS</b> recorded 68 receptions and 1,026 receiving yards, the second-most receiving yards and third-most receptions ever by a rookie tight end.</li> </ul> <p>Became the third rookie tight end in league history with 100 receiving yards in at least three games, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer <b>MIKE DITKA</b> (five games in 1961) and <b>CHARLE YOUNG</b> (four games in 1973).</p> <p>In Weeks 5 and 7, became the second rookie tight end in NFL history with at least 100 receiving yards in consecutive games, joining <b>RAYMOND CHESTER</b> (Weeks 5-6, 1970).</p> <p>In Week 7, had 163 receiving yards, the fourth-most by a rookie tight end in a game all-time.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>RB <b>CORDARRELLE PATTERSON</b> was one of two players in the league (<b>AUSTIN EKELER</b>) with at least 500 rushing yards (618) and 500 receiving yards (548) this season.</li> </ul> <p>Was one of three players in the league (Ekeler and <b>DEEBO SAMUEL</b>) with at least five rushing touchdowns (six) and five receiving touchdowns (five) this season.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>LB <b>FOYESADE OLUOKUN</b> led the NFL with 192 tackles, the most by any player in a season since 2000.</li> </ul>
<b>BALTIMORE RAVENS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Won at least eight games for the sixth consecutive season and are one of four teams to win at least eight games in each season since 2016.</li> </ul> <p>Led NFL in rushing defense, allowing 84.5 rushing yards per game.</p> <p>Ranked third in NFL with 145.8 rushing yards per game.</p>

	<p>From Week 11 of the 2018 season to Week 4 of this season, the Ravens rushed for at least 100 yards in in 43 consecutive regular-season games, tied with the <b>PITTSBURGH STEELERS</b> (43 consecutive games from 1974-77) for the longest such streak in NFL history.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>QB <b>LAMAR JACKSON</b> ranked second among quarterbacks with 767 rushing yards and is the first quarterback in NFL history with at least 600 rushing yards in each of his first four seasons</li> </ul> <p>Joined <b>CAM NEWTON</b> (four seasons) and <b>MICHAEL VICK</b> (four) as the only quarterbacks all-time with four career seasons with at least 600 rushing yards.</p> <p>Has 3,673 career rushing yards, surpassing <b>CAM NEWTON</b> (2,571) for the most by a quarterback in his first four seasons in NFL history.</p> <p>Has 21 career rushing touchdowns, tied with <b>STEVE GROGAN</b> and <b>DAK PRESCOTT</b> for the fourth-most by a quarterback in his first four seasons in NFL history.</p> <p>Has 10 career games with at least 100 rushing yards, tied with <b>MICHAEL VICK</b> (10 games) for the most such games by a quarterback in NFL history.</p> <p>Became the first quarterback in NFL history to record multiple career games with at least three touchdown passes and 100 rushing yards.</p> <p>Earned 37 wins prior to turning 25, surpassing Pro Football Hall of Famer <b>DAN MARINO</b> (34 wins) for the most wins by a starting quarterback prior to his 25th birthday in NFL history.</p> <p>In his first 40 career starts, had 90 touchdowns (70 passing, 20 rushing) and joined <b>PATRICK MAHOMES</b> (107 touchdowns) and Pro Football Hall of Famers <b>DAN MARINO</b> (95) and <b>KURT WARNER</b> (91) as the only quarterbacks with at least 90 combined passing and rushing touchdowns in their first 40 career starts in NFL history.</p> <p>TE <b>MARK ANDREWS</b> led all tight ends with career-highs in receptions (107) and receiving yards (1,361), the third-most receiving yards and tied for the third-most receptions ever by a tight end in a single season</p> <p>From Weeks 14-15, became the second tight end all-time with at least 10 catches, 100 receiving yards and a touchdown reception in consecutive games, joining <b>TRAVIS KELCE</b> (Week 11 and Week 13, 2018).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>LB <b>ODAFE OWEH</b> tied for the lead among rookies with three forced fumbles and ranked fourth with five sacks.</li> <li>K <b>JUSTIN TUCKER</b> made 94.6 percent of his field goals (35 of 37), the highest field-goal percentage in the NFL this season.</li> </ul> <p>Has eight career games with multiple 50-yard field goals, the most in NFL history.</p> <p>In Week 3, converted a game-winning 66-yard field goal as time expired, the longest made field goal in NFL history</p>
<b>BUFFALO BILLS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Won the AFC East (11-6) for the second consecutive season, marking the first time they won consecutive division titles since 1988-91.</li> </ul> <p>Led the NFL in scoring defense (17.0 points allowed per game) and total defense (272.8 yards allowed per game), ranked third in scoring offense</p>

(28.4 points per game) and ranked fifth in the NFL in total offense (381.9 yards per game).

Was the only team to rank in the top-five in both total offense and total defense.

Tied for third in the NFL with 30 takeaways (19 interceptions, 11 fumble recoveries).

Became the third team since 1990 to record two shutouts in its first four games of a season, joining the **BALTIMORE RAVENS** (2000) and **WASHINGTON** (1991).

- QB **JOSH ALLEN** recorded 4,407 passing yards and 36 touchdown passes, becoming the first player in franchise history to record at least 4,000 passing yards consecutive seasons.

Became the first player in NFL history with at least 100 touchdown passes (103) and 30 rushing touchdowns (31) in his first four seasons.

Ranked third among quarterbacks with six rushing touchdowns and became the first quarterback ever with at least six rushing touchdowns in each of his first four seasons.

Has five games with at least two rushing touchdowns since entering the NFL in 2018, tied with **JALEN HURTS** (five) for the most such games by a quarterback in his first four seasons in the Super Bowl era.

Has 31 career rushing touchdowns, trailing only **CAM NEWTON** (33) for the most by a quarterback in his first three seasons in NFL history.

Has five career games with at least 300 passing yards and 50 rushing yards, surpassing **MICHAEL VICK** (four games) and **RUSSELL WILSON** (four) for the second-most such games all-time. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer **STEVE YOUNG** (eight games) has more.

Became the fifth player ever to record five games with at least 300 passing yards and four touchdown passes in his first four seasons, joining **PATRICK MAHOMES** (nine games), Pro Football Hall of Famers **DAN MARINO** (nine) and **KURT WARNER** (six), and **ANDREW LUCK** (six).

Became the fourth player in NFL history to record multiple career games with at least 300 passing yards, four touchdown passes and one rushing touchdown, joining **DREW BREES** (four games), **AARON RODGERS** (three) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (two).

In Week 14, became the third quarterback all-time with at least 300 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in a single game, joining **CAM NEWTON** (340 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in Week 15, 2015) and **RUSSELL WILSON** (313 passing yards and 106 rushing yards in Week 7, 2014).

- WR **STEFON DIGGS** recorded 103 receptions and 1,225 receiving yards, becoming the first player in franchise history with at least 100 receptions and 1,000 receiving yards in consecutive seasons.

Is one of two players (**MIKE EVANS**) with at least 1,000 receiving yards and six touchdown receptions in each of the past four seasons.

- TE **DAWSON KNOX** tied for the league lead among tight ends with a career-high nine touchdown receptions, the most in franchise history by a tight end.

<b>CAROLINA PANTHERS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ranked second in the NFL in total defense (305.9 yards allowed per game) and fourth in passing defense (192.1 passing yards allowed per game).</li> <li>• QB <b>CAM NEWTON</b> has 75 career rushing touchdowns and 45 games with both a passing and rushing touchdown, both the most-ever by a quarterback.  Had five rushing touchdowns this season and became the sixth player since 1990 with at least five rushing touchdowns in at least nine of his first 11 seasons.  Became the first quarterback all-time with a rushing touchdown in each of his first five games of a season and the second quarterback in the Super Bowl era with a rushing touchdown in five consecutive games, joining <b>KYLER MURRAY</b> (2020).</li> <li>• QB <b>SAM DARNOLD</b> became the first quarterback in NFL history to record five rushing touchdowns in his team's first four games of a season.  From Weeks 3-4, became the sixth quarterback since 1970 to record multiple rushing touchdowns in consecutive games.</li> <li>• WR <b>D.J. MOORE</b> had 1,157 receiving yards and joined <b>STEVE SMITH</b> (four consecutive seasons) as the only wide receivers in franchise history with at least 1,000 receiving yards in three consecutive seasons.</li> <li>• RB <b>CHRISTIAN MCCAFFREY</b> has 11 career games with at least 10 receptions, the most by a running back in NFL history, and surpassed <b>JULIO JONES</b> (10 games) for the third-most such games by a player in his first five career seasons all-time. Only <b>MICHAEL THOMAS</b> (18 games) and <b>BRANDON MARSHALL</b> (12) have more.</li> <li>• RB <b>CHUBA HUBBARD</b> ranked tied for second among rookies with five rushing touchdowns and fifth with 612 rushing yards.</li> <li>• S <b>JEREMY CHINN</b> led the team with 106 tackles and is the only defensive back in the NFL with at least 100 tackles in each of the past two seasons.</li> </ul>
<b>CHICAGO BEARS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ranked fourth in the league in sacks (49) and sixth in total defense (316.7 yards allowed per game).</li> <li>• QB <b>JUSTIN FIELDS</b> led all rookie quarterbacks with 420 rushing yards.  In Week 8, became the third rookie quarterback in NFL history to record a passing touchdown, rushing touchdown and at least 100 rushing yards in a single game, joining <b>ROBERT GRIFFIN III</b> (October 14, 2012) and <b>MARCUS MARIOTA</b> (December 6, 2015).</li> <li>• RB <b>DAVID MONTGOMERY</b> had 1,150 scrimmage yards (849 rushing, 301 receiving) and is the fourth player in franchise history with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards in each of his first four seasons.</li> <li>• LB <b>ROBERT QUINN</b> ranked second in the NFL with 18.5 sacks, the most in a single season in franchise history.</li> </ul>

<b>CINCINNATI BENGALS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li> <p>Won AFC North division title (10-7) for first time since 2015.</p> <p>Ranked fifth in NFL in run defense, allowing 102.5 rushing yards per game.</p> <p>Became the first team ever with a 4,000-yard passer (<b>JOE BURROW</b>), 1,000-yard rusher (<b>JOE MIXON</b>) and two 1,000-yard receivers (<b>JA'MARR CHASE</b> and <b>TEE HIGGINS</b>) each under the age of 26.</p> </li> <li> <p>QB <b>JOE BURROW</b> had 4,611 passing yards and 34 touchdown passes, both single-season franchise records.</p> <p>Ranked second in the NFL with a 108.3 passer rating.</p> <p>Has 11 career games with at least 300 passing yards, the second-most by a player in his first two seasons all-time. Only <b>JUSTIN HERBERT</b> (16 games) had more.</p> <p>Has three career games with at least 400 passing yards and three touchdown passes, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer <b>DAN MARINO</b> as the only quarterbacks with three such games in their first two career seasons all-time.</p> <p>In Week 16, recorded 525 passing yards, the fourth-most in a single game in NFL history.</p> <p>From Weeks 16-17, had 971 passing yards, surpassing <b>PHIL SIMMS</b> (945 passing yards in Weeks 5-6, 1985) for the second-most passing yards by a quarterback in a two-game span ever. Only <b>DAK PRESCOTT</b> (974 passing yards in Weeks 3-4, 2020) had more.</p> <p>Had at least two touchdown passes in each of his first eight games of the season and joined Pro Football Hall of Famer <b>DAN MARINO</b> (first 10 games in 1984) as the only first- or second-year quarterbacks with at least two touchdown passes in each of their team's first eight games of a season in NFL history.</p> </li> <li> <p>RB <b>JOE MIXON</b> ranked third in the NFL with a career-high 1,205 rushing yards and fourth with a career-high 13 rushing touchdowns.</p> <p>Was one of three running backs (<b>AUSTIN EKELER</b> and <b>JONATHAN TAYLOR</b>) with at least 1,500 scrimmage yards (1,519) and 15 touchdowns (16).</p> </li> <li> <p>WR <b>JA'MARR CHASE</b> ranked fourth in the NFL with 1,455 receiving yards, the most by a rookie in the Super Bowl era.</p> <p>In Week 17, recorded 266 receiving yards, the most-ever by a rookie in a single game.</p> <p>In Week 7, at 21 years and 237 days old, became the second-youngest player in NFL history to record at least 200 receiving yards in a single game, trailing only <b>MIKE EVANS</b> (21 years, 87 days old).</p> <p>Became the first rookie ever and the fifth player in the Super Bowl era to record multiple games with at least 200 receiving yards in a single season.</p> <p>Became the fifth rookie since 1970 with multiple games of at least 150 receiving yards and a touchdown reception.</p> </li> </ul>

	<p>Became the fifth player in the Super Bowl era to record a touchdown catch in six of his first eight career games.</p> <p>Joined <b>EARL MCCULLOUGH</b> (1968) as the only rookies in NFL history with at least 50 receiving yards in each of their first seven career games,</p> <p>Became the third rookie since 1990 with at least five touchdown receptions in his team's first five games of a season.</p> <p>Became the third rookie in NFL history with a touchdown reception of at least 25 yards in each of his first three career games.</p> <p>Became the second player since 1970 to record a touchdown reception of at least 40 yards in each of his first two career games, joining <b>SAMMY WHITE</b> (1976).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>WR <b>TEE HIGGINS</b> had a career-high 1,091 receiving yards and became the third player in franchise history with at least 900 receiving yards in each of his first two seasons.</li> <li>With Chase and Higgins, the Bengals became the first team ever with two players under the age of 23 to each record at least 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.</li> </ul> <p>With Chase, Higgins and <b>TYLER BOYD</b> (828 receiving yards), the Bengals were the only team in the NFL with three wide receivers each with at least 800 receiving yards.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DE <b>TREY HENDRICKSON</b> ranked fifth in the NFL with a franchise-record 14 sacks.</li> </ul> <p>Is one of two players in the NFL (<b>T.J. WATT</b>) with at least 13 sacks in each of the past two seasons.</p> <p>From Weeks 5-16, became the second player since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic, to register at least half of a sack in 11 consecutive games within a single season, joining <b>CHRIS JONES</b> (2018).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>LB <b>LOGAN WILSON</b> was one of two linebackers in the NFL (<b>DARIUS LEONARD</b>) with at least 90 tackles (98) and four interceptions (four).</li> <li>K <b>EVAN MCPHERSON</b> led the NFL with nine made field goals of at least 50 yards, the second-most all-time by a rookie kicker. Only <b>BLAIR WALSH</b> (10 50-yard field goals in 2012) had more.</li> </ul>
<b>CLEVELAND BROWNS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In Week 9, became the first team in 54 years and the fourth team all-time to record a touchdown pass, rushing touchdown and defensive touchdown each of at least 60 yards in a single game, joining Kansas City and Washington in 1966 and the San Diego Chargers in 1967.</li> <li>QB <b>BAKER MAYFIELD</b> passed for 3,010 yards and is one of nine quarterbacks all-time with at least 3,000 passing yards in each of his first four seasons.</li> </ul> <p>Was one of two quarterbacks (<b>DEREK CARR</b>, Week 7) to record a completion percentage of 90-or-higher (90.5 percent, 19 of 21 attempts in Week 2) in a single game this season.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>RB <b>NICK CHUBB</b> ranked second in the NFL with 1,259 rushing yards and had eight rushing touchdowns, becoming the sixth player all-time with at least 950 rushing yards and eight-or-more rushing touchdowns in each of his first four seasons.</li> </ul>

WATT</b>) with at least 10 sacks in each of the past four seasons.</li> </ul> <p>Had 54.5 sacks through his first 60 career games, the third-most by a player in his first 60 NFL games since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic. Only Pro Football Hall of Famers <b>REGGIE WHITE</b> (72.5) and <b>DERRICK THOMAS</b> (55) had more.</p>
<b>DALLAS COWBOYS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Won the NFC East division title (12-5) for first time since 2018 and won at least 12 games for the first time since 2016.</li> </ul> <p>Led the NFL in scoring offense (31.2 points per game) and total offense (407 yards per game).</p> <p>Led the NFL with 34 takeaways (26 interceptions, eight fumble recoveries).</p> <p>From Weeks 13-15, became the first team since the 2007 <b>DETROIT LIONS</b> (Weeks 8-10) with at least four takeaways in three consecutive games within a season.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• QB <b>DAK PRESCOTT</b> recorded 4,449 passing yards and a franchise-record 37 touchdown passes.</li> </ul> <p>Ranked third in the NFL with 104.2 passer rating.</p> <p>Joined <b>DAUNTE CULPEPPER</b> and <b>CAM NEWTON</b> as the only players with at least 125 touchdown passes (143) and 25 rushing touchdowns (25) in their first six seasons in league annals.</p> <p>Has 17 career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown, the fourth-most such games by a quarterback in his first six seasons in NFL history. Only <b>CAM NEWTON</b> (35), <b>DAUNTE CULPEPPER</b> (20) and <b>JOSH ALLEN</b> (19) had more.</p> <p>In his first 75 career starts, had 39 games with a passer rating of 100-or-higher, the third-most such games by a player in his first 75 career starts in NFL history.
