FANTASY WORDLE LEAGUE OFFICIAL RULES


REGULAR SEASON

• Each player will follow a predetermined regular season schedule and play a different person each day in head-to-head play.

GAMES

- The player that scores the most points in each game is the winner. The score is determined by adding together the numbers from guesses A and B. See scoring examples below.
 - Guess A Solving guess
 - 54 pts = solving the puzzle in one guess
 - 45 pts = solving the puzzle in two guesses
 - 36 pts = solving the puzzle in three guesses
 - 27 pts = solving the puzzle in four guesses
 - 18 pts = solving the puzzle in five guesses
 - 9 pts = solving the puzzle in six guesses
 - 0 pts = not solving puzzle
 - Guess B Guess prior to the solving guess (or the final guess on an unsolved puzzle)
 - 2 pts = each green square
 - 1 pt = each yellow square

Scoring examples:



- The following steps are used to determine the winner of a game ending in a tie score:
 - 1. Most green boxes in guess B.
 - 2. Most points in guess C (2 pts = green square; 1 pt = yellow square)
 - 3. Most green boxes in guess C.
 - 4. Steps 2 & 3 are repeated until guesses are exhausted.

An additional point is added to the game score of the player that wins the tiebreaker. If the above steps do not break the tie, the game ends tied.

• If a game ends in a tie in the playoffs, the two players play a rematch the next day.

PLAYOFFS

- At the end of the regular season, the top four players are seeded #1 #4 (based on winloss record) and compete in a four-player playoff bracket for the Wordle World Champion title.
 - Note: "Win Points" are used to determined best win-loss records. Players receive 2 Win Points for each win and 1 Win Point for each tie.
- If two or more players share the same record at the end of the season, ties will be broken as follows:
 - 1. Most points scored during the regular season.
 - 2. Best head-to-head win-loss record between two tied players. (This step not used if three or more players are tied.)
 - 3. Most head-to-head points scored between two tied players. (This step not used if three or more players are tied.)
 - 4. A head-to-head matchup.

TOILET BOWL

• At the end of the regular season, the two players with the worst win-loss records also qualify for post-season play. They compete in the Toilet Bowl. The loser of the Toilet Bowl determines the official last place finisher.
