CLOSE GAMES, COMEBACKS & FANTASTIC FINISHES

- The average final score margin of 9.70 points this season was the lowest for a full season since 1932 (9.13).

TURNAROUND TEAMS

 Seven teams qualified for the postseason in 2022 after missing the playoff last season: BALTIMORE, JACKSONVILLE, the LOS ANGELES CHARGERS, MIAMI, MINNESOTA, the NEW YORK GIANTS and SEATTLE.

Since 1990 – a streak of 33 consecutive seasons – at least four teams have qualified for the playoffs in every season that were not in the postseason the year before.

Two teams won division titles – Jacksonville (AFC South) and Minnesota (NFC North) – after missing the playoffs
last season.

At least two teams have won their divisions the season after missing the playoffs in 19 of the past 20 years.

 Jacksonville completed the "worst-to-first" turnaround this season, winning the AFC South after finishing in last place in 2021.

At least one team has won its division the season after finishing in or tied for last place in 18 of the past 20 seasons.

ARIZONA CARDINALS

• QB KYLER MURRAY had two games with two touchdown passes and one rushing touchdown this season and tied with JOSH ALLEN (11) for the second-most such games by a quarterback in his first four seasons in NFL history. Only CAM NEWTON (12) had more.

Has 2,204 career rushing yards and 23 career rushing touchdowns and became the fourth quarterback with at least 2,000 rushing yards and 20 rushing touchdowns in their first four career seasons in NFL history, joining with **JOSH ALLEN**, **LAMAR JACKSON** and **CAM NEWTON**.

 RB JAMES CONNER had 1,082 scrimmage yards (782 rushing, 300 receiving) and eight scrimmage touchdowns (seven rushing, one receiving).

Is one of five running backs with at least six scrimmage touchdowns in each of past five seasons.

 WR DEANDRE HOPKINS has 853 career receptions and became the fourth player ever with at least 850 receptions in his first 10 career seasons, joining MARVIN HARRISON (927 receptions), BRANDON MARSHALL (882) and TORRY HOLT (869).

Became fifth-fastest player in NFL history to reach 800 career receptions (138 games). Only **ANTONIO BROWN** (126 games), **JULIO JONES** (127), Pro Football Hall of Famer **MARVIN HARRISON** (131) and **ANDRE JOHNSON** (137) reached the mark faster.

• DE **J.J. WATT** had 12.5 sacks, his fifth-career season with at least 12 sacks, tied for the most among active players.

Ranked tied-fourth in NFL with 18 tackles for loss and had five games with at least two tackles for loss, tied for the third most in the NFL in 2022.

S BUDDA BAKER had 111 tackles, his fourth-career season with at least 100 tackles, while S
 JALEN THOMPSON had 109 tackles and LB ZAVEN COLLINS had 100 tackles in 2022.

One of four teams with three players each having at least 100 tackles.

Baker is only defensive back with at least 95 tackles in each of the past five seasons.

Thompson is one of two defensive backs with at least 100 tackles in each of the past two seasons, along with **DERWIN JAMES**.

Collins was one of eight linebackers in 2022 with at least 100 tackles, 10 tackles for loss (11) and five passes defensed (six).

ATLANTA FALCONS

- **ATLANTA** led NFL in rushing attempts (559) and ranked third in rushing yards (2,718), second-most rushing yards in single season in franchise history (2,939 in 2006).
 - Became fourth team in NFL history with a 1,000-yard rookie running back (TYLER ALLGEIER) and 800-yard rookie receiver (DRAKE LONDON), joining the 2010 TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS (RB LeGarrette Blount and WR Mike Williams), 2004 DETROIT LIONS (RB Kevin Jones and WR Roy Williams) and 2003 HOUSTON TEXANS (RB Domanick Williams and WR Andre Johnson).
- QB MARCUS MARIOTA completed 13 of 14 pass attempts (92.9 percent) and had three touchdowns (two passing, one rushing) in Week 6 and became the third player in NFL history to record at least two touchdown passes, one rushing touchdown and a completion percentage of 90-or-higher (minimum 10 attempts) in a single game, joining RYAN FITZPATRICK (September 24, 2020) and FRANK RYAN (December 12, 1964).
- RB CORDARRELLE PATTERSON recorded a 103-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in Week 11, his ninth-career kickoff return for a touchdown and surpassed JOSH CRIBBS (eight) and LEON WASHINGTON (eight) for the most in NFL history.
- RB TYLER ALLGEIER had franchise rookie-record 1,035 rushing yards, second-most among rookies in 2022.
 - Became sixth rookie in the past 16 seasons that was drafted in the fifth round or later or undrafted to surpass 1,000 rushing yards, joining **LEGARRETTE BLOUNT** (2010), **JORDAN HOWARD** (2016), **PHILLIP LINDSAY** (2018), **ALFRED MORRIS** (2012) and **JAMES ROBINSON** (2020).
- WR **DRAKE LONDON** ranked tied-second among rookies in receptions (franchise rookie-record 72) and third in receiving yards (866).
- LB RASHAAN EVANS led team and ranked tied-sixth in NFL with career-high 159 tackles.
 - Was one of two players (ZAIRE FRANKLIN) with 10 games of at least 10 tackles in 2022.
- S RICHIE GRANT led NFC and ranked third in NFL among defensive backs with career-high 122 tackles.

BALTIMORE RAVENS

• **BALTIMORE** ranked third in scoring defense (18.5 points per game allowed) and rushing defense (92.1 yards allowed per game) and tied for fifth in sacks (48).

Led NFL with 12 games of at least 150 rushing yards and ranked second in rushing yards (2,720) and third in rushing yards per attempt (5.17).

With CALAIS CAMPBELL (99 sacks), JUSTIN HOUSTON (111.5) and JASON PIERRE-PAUL (94.5), the Ravens became the second team since 1982 to have three players with at least 90 career sacks on its active roster for a game, joining the 1994 GREEN BAY PACKERS (Sean Jones, Steve McMichael and Pro Football Hall of Famer Reggie White).

 QB LAMAR JACKSON has 4,437 career rushing yards and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer STEVE YOUNG (4,239) for the fifth-most rushing yards by a quarterback in NFL history.

Had 764 rushing yards this season and joined **CAM NEWTON** as the only quarterbacks with at least 500 rushing yards in each of their first five seasons in NFL history.

Has 12 career games with at least 100 rushing yards and surpassed **MICHAEL VICK** (10 games) for the most such games by a quarterback in NFL history.

In Week 2, had a 79-yard touchdown run and a 75-yard touchdown pass and became the first player in NFL history to record both a rushing touchdown and touchdown pass of at least 75 yards in the same game.

In Week 3, became the second player in NFL history to record at least four touchdown passes (four), 100 rushing yards (107) and a rushing touchdown in a single game, joining **RANDALL CUNNINGHAM** (four touchdown passes, 124 rushing yards and a rushing touchdown on November 4, 1990).

In Weeks 2-3, became the first player in the Super Bowl era to record at least three touchdown passes and 100-or-more rushing yards in consecutive games.

Compiled a 38-12 record in his first 50 career starts, tied with **TOM BRADY** (38 wins) and **DANNY WHITE** (38) for the third-most wins by a quarterback in his first 50 career starts since 1970. Only **PATRICK MAHOMES** (40 wins) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **KEN STABLER** (40) had more.

TE MARK ANDREWS had 73 receptions, tied third-most among tight ends, for 847 yards, third-most among tight ends, and five touchdowns.

Has 336 career receptions, fifth-most by a tight end in his first five seasons in NFL history.

Has 4,313 career receiving yards, sixth-most by a tight end in his first five seasons in NFL history.

Is one of two tight ends (**TRAVIS KELCE**) with at least five touchdown receptions in each of the past four seasons.

Is one of three tight ends (**TRAVIS KELCE** and **GEORGE KITTLE**) with at least 500 receiving yards in each of the past five seasons.

• LB ROQUAN SMITH ranked tied for third with 169 tackles, his fifth-consecutive season with at least 100 tackles, and added 11 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks and career-high three interceptions.

BALTIMORE RAVENS

Is the first linebacker since 2009 (**PATRICK WILLIS**) with at least 150 tackles, four sacks and three interceptions in a season.

Is one of two (**DEMARIO DAVIS**) with at least 100 tackles and 10 tackles for loss in each of the past three seasons.

- LB **JUSTIN HOUSTON** had 9.5 sacks, his seventh-career season with at least nine sacks, tied second-most among active players.
- LB **PATRICK QUEEN** had 117 tackles, nine tackles for loss, six passes defensed, five sacks, two interceptions and two fumble recoveries.

Was one of four (**DEMARIO DAVIS**, **BOBBY WAGNER** and **DEVIN WHITE**) with at least 100 tackles, five sacks and five passes defensed this season.

- CB MARLON HUMPHREY was one of two defensive backs (L'JARIUS SNEED) with at least three interceptions (three) and three sacks (three).
- K **JUSTIN TUCKER** led AFC and ranked second in NFL with career-high 142 kicking points and led all players with 37 made field goals.

Has 57 career 50-yard field goals and surpassed **JASON HANSON** (52) for the third-most in NFL history, trailing only **MATT PRATER** (71) and **SEBASTIAN JANIKOWSKI** (58).

BUFFALO BILLS

• **BUFFALO** (13-3) won their third-consecutive AFC East division title, the first time they have won the division in three consecutive seasons since 1988-91.

Was one of two teams (**DALLAS**) to rank in top five in both scoring offense (28.4 points per game - second) and scoring defense (17.9 points per game allowed – second)

 QB JOSH ALLEN had 35 touchdown passes and seven rushing touchdowns in 2022 and became the first quarterback in NFL history with three career seasons of at least 30 touchdown passes and five rushing touchdowns.

Became the first quarterback with at least six rushing touchdowns in five consecutive seasons in NFL history.

Has 176 career combined passing and rushing touchdowns (138 passing, 38 rushing) and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (171) for the most by a player in his first five seasons in NFL history.

Has 38 career rushing touchdowns, tied with **KORDELL STEWART** (38) for the fourth-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback in NFL history. Only **CAM NEWTON** (75), Pro Football Hall of Famer **STEVE YOUNG** (43) and **JACK KEMP** (40) have more.

Has 18,397 career passing yards and 3,087 career rushing yards and joined **CAM NEWTON** as the only quarterbacks ever with at least 15,000 passing yards and 3,000 rushing yards in their first five career seasons.

Has nine career games with at least four touchdown passes and surpassed **ANDREW LUCK** (eight games) for the third-most such games by a player in his first five seasons in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (14 games) and **PATRICK MAHOMES** (13) had more.

Allen has 13 career games with at least 300 passing yards and three touchdown passes and surpassed **ANDREW LUCK** (12 games) for the fourth-most such games by a player in his first five seasons in NFL history. Only **PATRICK MAHOMES** (19) and Pro Football Hall of Famers **DAN MARINO** (19) and **KURT WARNER** (17) had more.

Has 25 career games with at least one touchdown pass and one rushing touchdown and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer FRAN TARKENTON (24 games) for the fourth-most such games in NFL history. Only CAM NEWTON (45 games), Pro Football Hall of Famer STEVE YOUNG (31) and AARON RODGERS (30) have more.

Has six career games with at least two rushing touchdowns, surpassing **JACK KEMP** (five games), **JOHNNY LUJACK** (five) and **CAM NEWTON** (five) for the third-most such games by a quarterback in his first five NFL seasons all-time. Only **JALEN HURTS** (eight) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **OTTO GRAHAM** (seven games) had more.

Became the third player in NFL history with at least 300 passing yards and 75 rushing yards in three career games, joining **MICHAEL VICK** and **RUSSELL WILSON**.

 WR STEFON DIGGS had 108 receptions for 1,429 yards and career-high 11 touchdowns in 2022.

Is one of seven players ever to record at least 100 receptions and 1,200 receiving yards in three-

or-more consecutive seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers MARVIN HARRISON (1999-2002) and JERRY RICE (1994-96) as well as DAVANTE ADAMS (2020-22), ANTONIO BROWN (2013-18), HERMAN MOORE (1995-97) and MICHAEL THOMAS (2017-19).

Became the first player in NFL history with at least 100 receptions and 1,200 receiving yards in each of his first three seasons with a team.

Has 703 career receptions and became the sixth player ever with 700 receptions in his first eight career seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer MARVIN HARRISON (759 receptions), DEANDRE HOPKINS (747), ANTONIO BROWN (733), TORRY HOLT (712) and BRANDON MARSHALL (712).

• RB **DEVIN SINGLETARY** had career-high 1,099 scrimmage yards (819 rushing, 280 receiving) and six touchdowns (five rushing, one receiving).

Became first Bills player since Pro Football Hall of Famer **THURMAN THOMAS** with at least 900 scrimmage yards in each of his first four career seasons.

 LB VON MILLER had eight sacks, his 10th-career season with at least eight sacks, most among active players.

Had 10 tackles for loss, his 11th-career season with at least nine tackles for loss, most among active players.

- LB **TREMAINE EDMUNDS** led team with 102 tackles and is one of six with at least 100 tackles in each of past five seasons.
- LB MATT MILANO had 99 tackles, 12 tackles for loss, 11 passes defensed and three
 interceptions and was only player in NFL with at least 10 tackles for loss and 10 passes
 defensed.

CAROLINA PANTHERS

- CAROLINA rushed for 240 yards in the first half of Week 16, the third-most rushing yards in a first half in the past 40 years. Only BUFFALO on November 22, 1992 (254 rushing yards) and JACKSONVILLE on December 10, 2006 (251) had more.
- In Week 18, guard **MICHAEL JORDAN** recovered a fumble in the end zone in the Panthers' 10-7 win at New Orleans.

Carolina became the third team since 2000 to win a game in which their only touchdown was scored by an offensive lineman, joining **CHICAGO** on December 9, 2018 (**BRADLEY SOWELL** touchdown reception) and **DETROIT** on December 17, 2000 (**JEFF HARTINGS** fumble-recovery touchdown).

- In Week 16, RBs D'ONTA FOREMAN (104 rushing yards) and CHUBA HUBBARD (109 rushing yards) became the first pair of teammates since Jacksonville's MAURICE JONES-DREW and FRED TAYLOR (December 10, 2006) each with at least 100 rushing yards in the first half of the same game.
- RB D'ONTA FOREMAN had career highs in rushing yards (914) and rushing touchdowns (five).

Had five games with at least 100 rushing yards, tied for the most among NFC running backs.

- WR D.J. MOORE led team with 63 catches for 888 yards and had a career-high seven touchdown receptions.
- DE BRIAN BURNS led team and set career highs with 12.5 sacks and 17 tackles for loss.

Had five games with multiple tackles for loss, tied third-most in the NFL.

Is one of five players with at least 7.5 sacks in each of the past four seasons.

 LB FRANKIE LUVU had career highs in tackles (111), tackles for loss (19), sacks (seven) and passes defensed (four).

Became the first player since **LAVONTE DAVID** (2013) with at least 100 tackles, 19 tackles for loss and seven sacks in a season.

Ranked tied for second in the NFL with 19 tackles for loss, most by Carolina player since **LUKE KUECHLY** in 2018 (20).

Had six games with multiple tackles for loss, tied for the most in the NFL.

 LB SHAQ THOMPSON led team with career-high 135 tackles, his fourth-consecutive season with at least 100 tackles.

CHICAGO BEARS

CHICAGO led the NFL with 3,014 rushing yards and became the fifth team ever with at least 3,000 rushing yards in a season, joining the 2019 BALTIMORE RAVENS (3,296 rushing yards), 1978 NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (3,165), 1973 BUFFALO BILLS (3,088) and 2020 BALTIMORE RAVENS (3,071).

From Weeks 6-10, **CHICAGO** became the first team in NFL history with at least 225 rushing yards in five consecutive games and the third team in NFL history with at least 200 rushing yards in five straight contests, joining the 1972 **PITTSBURGH STEELERS** (seven consecutive games) and 1951 **SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS** (six).

QB JUSTIN FIELDS had 1,143 rushing yards this season and surpassed MICHAEL VICK (1,039 rushing yards in 2006) for the second-most rushing yards by a quarterback in a single season in NFL history. Only LAMAR JACKSON (1,206 in 2019) had more.

From Weeks 7-11, became the second player in the Super Bowl era with at least one touchdown pass and one rushing touchdown in five consecutive games, joining **KYLER MURRAY** (five consecutive games in 2020).

Became the first quarterback in the Super Bowl era to rush for a touchdown in six consecutive games (Weeks 7-11, 13).

Had three rushing touchdowns of at least 50 yards in 2022, the most in a single season by a quarterback in NFL history and the most career 50-yard touchdown runs by a quarterback in the Super Bowl era.

Has four career games with at least 100 rushing yards, tied with **RUSSELL WILSON** (four games) for the third-most such games by a quarterback in the Super Bowl era. Only **LAMAR JACKSON** (12 games) and **MICHAEL VICK** (10) have more.

Had three games with at least 100 rushing yards this season and is the fourth quarterback with at least three games of 100-or-more rushing yards in a season in the Super Bowl era, joining **LAMAR JACKSON** (five games in 2019), **MICHAEL VICK** (three in 2004 and three in 2006) and **RUSSELL WILSON** (three in 2014).

In Week 9, rushed for a career-high 178 yards and surpassed **MICHAEL VICK** (173 rushing yards on December 1, 2002) for the most rushing yards by a quarterback in a regular-season game since at least 1940.

In Week 9, became the first player in NFL history with at least three touchdown passes, 150 rushing yards and a rushing touchdown in a single game.

In Week 10, became the fourth player in league annals to record a 50-yard touchdown pass and 50-yard rushing touchdown in the same game, joining **LAMAR JACKSON** (2022), **CAM NEWTON** (2012) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **ACE PARKER** (1938).

In Weeks 9-10, became the first quarterback since **TOBIN ROTE** (Weeks 8-9, 1951) with at least 125 rushing yards in consecutive games and his 325 rushing yards over those two games are the most rushing yards by a quarterback in a two-game span in NFL history.

In Week 11, became third quarterback in the Super Bowl era with at least 75 rushing yards in three consecutive games within a single season, joining **JOSH ALLEN** (three consecutive games

CHICAGO BEARS

in 2018) and LAMAR JACKSON (three consecutive games in 2019).

• RB **DAVID MONTGOMERY** had 1,117 scrimmage yards (801 rushing, 316 receiving) and six touchdowns (five rushing, one receiving).

Is one of five running backs with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards and five rushing touchdowns in each of the past four seasons, along with **NICK CHUBB**, **DALVIN COOK**, **DERRICK HENRY** and **JOSH JACOBS**.

- TE COLE KMET ranked tied for third among tight ends with a career-high seven touchdown receptions.
- LB NICHOLAS MORROW set career highs with 116 tackles and 11 tackles for loss.
- DB JAQUAN BRISKER ranked fourth among rookies with 104 tackles and led all rookie defensive backs with four sacks, tied with BILL BATES (four sacks in 1983) and DESMOND KING (four in 2017) for the most sacks by a rookie defensive back since 1982.

CINCINNATI BENGALS

- **CINCINNATI** (12-4) won consecutive AFC North division titles for the first time in franchise history.
- QB JOE BURROW ranked tied for second with 35 touchdown passes fifth in the NFL, fifth with 4,475 passing yards and sixth with a 100.8 passer rating, and had a career-high five rushing touchdowns.

Joined **JOSH ALLEN** and Pro Football Hall of Famer **STEVE YOUNG** as the only players in NFL history with at least 4,000 passing yards, 35 touchdown passes and five rushing touchdowns in a season.

Joined **ANDREW LUCK** (86 passing, 12 rushing) as the only quarterbacks in NFL history with at least 75 touchdown passes (82) and 10 rushing touchdowns (10) in their first three seasons.

Became the fifth player since 1970 with at least 75 touchdown passes (78) in his first 40 career games, joining **PATRICK MAHOMES** (101 touchdown passes) and **JUSTIN HERBERT** (82), as well as Pro Football Hall of Famers **DAN MARINO** (90) and **KURT WARNER** (86).

Has five career games with at least 400 passing yards, surpassing Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (four) for the most such games by a player in his first three seasons all-time.

Has 12 career touchdown passes of 50-or-more yards, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famers **DAN MARINO** (12) and **FRAN TARKENTON** (12) for the most such touchdown passes by a player in his first three seasons in NFL history.

Reached 7,500 passing yards in his 27th career game and 10,000 passing yards in his 36th career game, both tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **KURT WARNER** for the third-fastest player to reach those marks in NFL history.

In Week 7, passed for 481 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions for a 138.2 rating and added a rushing touchdown and became the third player in NFL history with at least 475 passing yards, three touchdown passes and one rushing touchdown in a single game, joining **NORM VAN BROCKLIN** (September 28, 1951) and **BILLY VOLEK** (December 19, 2004).

• RB **JOE MIXON** had career-high 60 receptions along with 1,255 scrimmage yards (814 rushing, 441 receiving) and nine touchdowns (seven rushing, two receiving).

Is one of three running backs (**NICK CHUBB** and **EZEKIEL ELLIOTT**) with at least 1,200 scrimmage yards and eight scrimmage touchdowns in four of the past five seasons.

In Week 9, had 211 scrimmage yards (153 rushing, 58 receiving) and five touchdowns (four rushing, one receiving) and became sixth player in the Super Bowl era with at least 200 scrimmage yards and five touchdowns in a single game, joining **SHAUN ALEXANDER** (September 29, 2002), **JAMAAL CHARLES** (December 15, 2013), **CLINTON PORTIS** (December 7, 2003), Pro Football Hall of Famer **JERRY RICE** (October 14, 1990) and **JONATHAN TAYLOR** (November 21, 2021).

In Week 9, became the third player in the Super Bowl era with at least four rushing touchdowns and one receiving touchdown in a single game, joining **SHAUN ALEXANDER** (September 29, 2002) and **JONATHAN TAYLOR** (November 21, 2021).

In Week 9, became the fourth player in NFL history to record three rushing touchdowns and a

CINCINNATI BENGALS

touchdown reception in a single half, joining **SHAUN ALEXANDER** (first half on September 29, 2002), Pro Football Hall of Famer **JIM BROWN** (second half on November 28, 1965) and **DUB JONES** (second half on November 25, 1951).

WR JA'MARR CHASE had career-high 87 receptions for 1,046 yards and nine touchdowns.

Became the fourth player in NFL history with at least 80 receptions and 1,000 receiving yards in each of his first two seasons, joining **ODELL BECKHAM JR.**, **JUSTIN JEFFERSON** and **MICHAEL THOMAS**.

Has 2,501 career receiving yards and 22 career receiving touchdowns and joined Pro Football Hall of Famer **RANDY MOSS** as the only players under the age of 23 with at least 2,000 receiving yards and 20 touchdown receptions in NFL history.

Became the fifth player in NFL history with at least 2,500 receiving yards in his first two seasons, joining **JUSTIN JEFFERSON** (3,016 receiving yards), **ODELL BECKHAM JR**. (2,755), Pro Football Hall of Famer **RANDY MOSS** (2,726) and **BILL GROMAN** (2,648).

Recorded his 20th touchdown reception in his 26th career game, tied with ROB GRONKOWSKI and DARYL TURNER for the fourth-fewest games to reach 20 career touchdown receptions since 1970. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer RANDY MOSS (20 games), ODELL BECKHAM JR. (22) and JOHN JEFFERSON (24) reached the mark in fewer games.

Has eight career games with at least 100 receiving yards and a touchdown reception, tied with **A.J. BROWN** and **JOHN JEFFERSON** for the third-most such games by a player in his first two career seasons in the Super Bowl era. Only **ODELL BECKHAM JR**.  WR TEE HIGGINS had 74 receptions for 1,029 yards and career-high seven touchdown receptions.

Is one of seven players with at least 65 receptions, 900 receiving yards and five touchdown receptions in each of his first three seasons in NFL history.

DE TREY HENDRICKSON had eight sacks and three forced fumbles.

Since 2020, is one of four players with at least 35 sacks (35.5), along with MYLES GARRETT (44 sacks), T.J. WATT (43) and HAASON REDDICK (39.5).

 S JESSIE BATES (71 tackles and four interceptions) and S VONN BELL (77 tackles and four interceptions) were only pair of teammates with at least 70 tackles and four interceptions.

CLEVELAND BROWNS

In Week 12, CLEVELAND became the second team since the regular-season overtime rule was
instituted in 1974 to score a game-tying touchdown in the final minute of the fourth quarter and
game-winning touchdown in the final minute of overtime in the same game, joining the CHICAGO
BEARS on September 23, 1991, who recorded the game-tying touchdown with no time remaining
in the fourth guarter and game-winning touchdown with 18 seconds remaining in overtime.

In Week 13, **CLEVELAND** became the first team with two defensive touchdowns and a special teams touchdown in a game since **GREEN BAY** in Week 11 of the 2014 season.

• RB **NICK CHUBB** ranked third with career-high 1,525 rushing yards and had career-high 13 touchdowns (12 rushing, one receiving), tied for the fifth-most rushing touchdowns this season.

Became the fifth player ever to record at least eight rushing touchdowns in each of his first five seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **JIM BROWN**, **EMMITT SMITH** and **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON**, as well as **ADRIAN PETERSON**.

Had seven games with at least 100 rushing yards, second-most in 2022.

Was one of three players (**AUSTIN EKELER** and **JOSH JACOBS**) with at least 50 scrimmage vards in all 17 games this season.

WR AMARI COOPER had 78 receptions for 1,160 yards and career-high nine touchdowns.

Became the sixth player in the Super Bowl era to record at least five touchdown receptions in each of his first eight seasons, joining GARY CLARK, MARQUES COLSTON, LARRY FITZGERALD and Pro Football Hall of Famers MARVIN HARRISON and RANDY MOSS.

• DE MYLES GARRETT led AFC and ranked tied for second in NFL with a career-high 16 sacks and ranked tied for fourth with a career-high 18 tackles for loss.

Led NFL with seven games with at least 1.5 sacks.

Became the seventh player since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic, to record 10-or-more sacks in at least five of his first six seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers RICHARD DENT, BRUCE SMITH, DERRICK THOMAS and REGGIE WHITE as well as VON MILLER and DEMARCUS WARE.

Had 61.5 career sacks in his first 70 career games and he surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **DERRICK THOMAS** (61 sacks) and **J.J. WATT** (61) for the third-most sacks by a player in his first 70 NFL games since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic. Only Pro Football Hall of Famers **REGGIE WHITE** (79) and **T.J. WATT** (62) had more.

 CB DENZEL WARD had 15 passes defensed, three interceptions and two fumble-recovery touchdowns.

Is only player with at least 10 passes defensed and multiple interceptions in each of the past five seasons.

Became the fourth defensive back since 2000 with at least two interception-return touchdowns and two fumble-return touchdowns in his first five career seasons, joining **MIKE BROWN**, **DEANGELO HALL** and **EDDIE JACKSON**.

CLEVELAND BROWNS

Ward and **MARTIN EMERSON** (15 passes defensed) were one of two pairs of teammates (Jacksonville's **TYSON CAMPBELL** and **DARIOUS WILLIAMS**) each with at least 15 passes defensed.

• K CADE YORK kicked a game-winning 58-yard game-winning field goal on Kickoff Weekend, the second-longest game-winning field goal by a rookie in the final two minutes of regulation or in overtime in NFL history, trailing only JAKE ELLIOTT (61-yard field goal with no time remaining on September 24, 2017).

DALLAS COWBOYS

DALLAS (12-5) clinched second-consecutive playoff berth.

Won at least 12 games in consecutive seasons for the first since 1992-95.

Ranked fourth in scoring offense (27.5 points per game) and fifth in scoring defense (20.1 points per game allowed), one of two teams (**BUFFALO**) to rank in the top five in both categories.

Led all teams in takeaways (33), ranked second in turnover differential (+10) and tied for third in sacks (54).

- QB DAK PRESCOTT had 2,860 pass yards and 24 touchdowns (23 passing, one rushing) in 12 starts, his sixth-career season with at least 20 touchdown passes.
- QB COOPER RUSH is one of two quarterbacks in NFL history to win each of his first four career starts and record a passer rating of 90-or-higher in each win (BROCK PURDY) and became the fifth undrafted quarterback to win each of his first five career starts in the Super Bowl era, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer KURT WARNER as well as KYLE ALLEN, DIETER BROCK and MIKE TOMCZAK.
- RB **EZEKIEL ELLIOTT** had 968 scrimmage yards (876 rushing, 92 receiving) and had 12 rushing touchdowns, his fourth-career season with at least 10 rushing touchdowns.

Is one of five players in NFL history with at least eight scrimmage touchdowns in each of his first seven career seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **JIM BROWN**, **EMMITT SMITH** and **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** as well as **ADRIAN PETERSON**.

 RB TONY POLLARD had set career highs with 1,378 scrimmage yards (1,007 rushing, 371 receiving) and 12 scrimmage touchdowns (nine rushing, three receiving).

Elliott and Pollard were first pair of running back teammates since 2017 (New Orleans' **ALVIN KAMARA** and **MARK INGRAM**) each with at least 12 scrimmage touchdowns in the same season.

Was one of three running backs (**AUSTIN EKELER** and **JAMAAL WILLIAMS**) with at least four games (four) with two-or-more scrimmage touchdowns.

In Week 11, became the fourth player since 1990 with at least 75 rushing yards, 100 receiving yards and two touchdown receptions in a single game, joining **JOEY GALLOWAY** (November 12, 1995), **TODD GURLEY** (December 24, 2017) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** (December 7, 2003).

 WR CEEDEE LAMB set career highs with 107 receptions for 1,359 yards and nine touchdowns, the fifth-most receptions and sixth-most receiving yards in the NFL in 2022.

Became second Cowboy ever with at least 100 receptions and 1,300 receiving yards in a season, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer **MICHAEL IRVIN** (1995).

Was one of five wide receivers with at least three games (three) with 10-or-more receptions and 100-or-more receiving yards, joining **JUSTIN JEFFERSON** (six games),

DALLAS COWBOYS

TYREEK HILL (four), STEFON DIGGS (three) and COOPER KUPP (three).

LB MICAH PARSONS had career-high 13.5 sacks with 14 tackles for loss.

Was one of two players (**HAASON REDDICK**) with at least 10 sacks, 10 tackles for loss, three forced fumbles (career-high three) and three fumble recoveries (career-high three).

Became the third player since 1982 to record at least 13 sacks in each of his first two seasons, joining **ALDON SMITH** (2011-12) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **REGGIE WHITE** (1985-86).

Has nine career games with at least two sacks, tied with **ALDON SMITH** (nine games) for the most such games by a player in his first two career seasons since 1982.

Recorded his 20th sack in his 23rd career game, tied with **DWIGHT FREENEY** (23 games), **SHAWNE MERRIMAN** (23) and **VON MILLER** (23) for the third-fewest games to reach 20 career sacks since 1982. Has 26.5 career sacks, sixth-most by a player in his first two NFL seasons since 1982.

- S **DONOVAN WILSON** led team with 99 tackles and led all defensive backs with a career-high five sacks.
- CB DARON BLAND ranked tied for second among rookies with team-high five interceptions.

DENVER BRONCOS

 QB RUSSELL WILSON has 308 career touchdown passes and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer DAN MARINO (298) for the second-most touchdown passes by a player in his first 11 career seasons. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer PEYTON MANNING (333 touchdown passes) has more.

Has 308 touchdown passes and 26 rushing touchdowns in his career, is the sixth player in NFL history with at least 300 touchdown passes and 25 rushing touchdowns, joining **TOM BRADY**, **DREW BREES**, Pro Football Hall of Famer **JOHN ELWAY**, **AARON RODGERS** and Pro Football Hall of Famer **FRAN TARKENTON**.

Has 4,966 rushing yards and surpassed **RANDALL CUNNINGHAM** (4,928) for the third-most rushing yards by a quarterback in NFL history. Only **MICHAEL VICK** (6,109 rushing yards) and **CAM NEWTON** (5,628) have more.

Passed for 3,524 yards and joined Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** as the only players with at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first 11 career seasons all-time.

Has 108 career regular-season wins, the third-most by a quarterback in his first 11 seasons in NFL history, trailing only Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (117) and **TOM BRADY** (111).

Has 117 career regular-season and postseason wins and surpassed **BEN ROETHLISBERGER** (116) for the third-most by a quarterback in his first 11 seasons in NFL history. Only **TOM BRADY** (125) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (124) had more.

 RB LATAVIUS MURRAY had 892 scrimmage yards (760 rushing, 132 receiving) and six rushing touchdowns.

In Week 4 with New Orleans and Week 8 with Denver, registered rushing touchdowns and became the first player to score a rushing touchdown for two different teams in London in the same season.

Is only running back with at least five scrimmage touchdowns and only player with at least 500 rushing yards in each of past eight seasons.

S JUSTIN SIMMONS ranked tied for first with career-high six interceptions.

Is only player with at least five interceptions in each of the past three seasons.

• LB ALEX SINGLETON (9.6 tackles per game) and LB JOSEY JEWELL (9.8) were only pair of teammates each to average at least 9.5 tackles per game.

DETROIT LIONS

• **DETROIT** (9-8) became the third team in NFL history to start a season 1-6 and finish with a winning record, joining the 2021 **MIAMI DOLPHINS** and 1970 **CINCINNATI BENGALS**.

Had 20.5 combined sacks from rookies and surpassed the 1999 **TENNESSEE TITANS** (19 sacks) for the most combined sacks by rookies in a season since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic.

Ranked fifth in NFL in scoring offense (26.6 points per game) and committed fewest turnovers (15).

• QB **JARED GOFF** had third-career 4,000-yard season (4,438) and third-career season with at least 25 touchdown passes (29).

Ended the season with 324 consecutive pass attempts without an interception, the fifth-longest such streak in NFL history.

 RB JAMAAL WILLIAMS led NFL with a career-high and franchise-record 17 rushing touchdowns and became the first Lions player to lead the league in rushing touchdowns since Pro Football Hall of Famer BARRY SANDERS in 1991.

Had career-high 1,066 rushing yards and became the first Lion to reach 1,000 rushing yards in a season since 2013 (**REGGIE BUSH**).

Had franchise-record six games with at least two rushing touchdowns and became the fourth player since 2000 with multiple rushing touchdowns in at least five of his team's first 10 games of a season, joining **SHAUN ALEXANDER** (six games in 2005), Pro Football Hall of Famer **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** (six in 2006) and **PRIEST HOLMES** (five in 2003).

WR AMON-RA ST. BROWN has 196 career receptions, tied with JUSTIN JEFFERSON (196) and MICHAEL THOMAS (196) for the most catches by a player in his first two seasons in NFL history.

Joined **MICHAEL THOMAS** and **ODELL BECKHAM JR**. as the only players ever with at least 90 receptions and 900 receiving yards in each of their first two seasons.

In Week 2, became the third player ever to record at least eight receptions in eight consecutive games, joining **ANTONIO BROWN** (eight consecutive games in 2014) and **MICHAEL THOMAS** (eight in 2019).

In Week 2, became the third player all-time under the age of 23 to record a touchdown reception in at least six consecutive games, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer **RANDY MOSS** (seven consecutive games in 1998) and **ROB GRONKOWSKI** (six consecutive games in 2011).

Passed for 3,695 yards and 26 touchdowns, his 13th-career season with at least 25 touchdown passes, fourth-most in NFL history.

Became the fifth quarterback with 150 career games (150) with at least two touchdown passes, joining **TOM BRADY** (204), **DREW BREES** (173) and Pro Football Hall of Famers **PEYTON MANNING** (165) and **BRETT FAVRE** (159).

Became the second quarterback with at least 100 career games (103) with at least two touchdown passes and no interceptions, joining **TOM BRADY** (122).

 RB AARON JONES had 1,516 scrimmage yards (career-high 1,121 rushing, 395 receiving) and seven scrimmage touchdowns (two rushing, five receiving).

Is only player with at least 30 rushing touchdowns (31) and 15 receiving touchdowns (16) since 2019.

DB JONATHAN OWENS ranked second among defensive backs with a career-high 125 tackles.

Had seven games with at least 10 tackles, most among defensive backs in 2022 and the most such games by a defensive back in a season since 2014 (**MORGAN BURNETT** – seven games).

- DB JALEN PITRE and DB JONATHAN OWENS became first pair of defensive back teammates each with at least 125 tackles since 2000.

Passed for 3,057 yards in 12 starts and has 14 career seasons with at least 3,000 passing yards.

Has 76 career games with at least 300 passing yards and surpassed **PHILIP RIVERS** for the fourth-most such games in NFL history. Only **DREW BREES** (123 games), **TOM BRADY** (113) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (93) have more.

Has 30 career games with at least 350 passing yards and surpassed **PHILIP RIVERS** (29 games) for the fifth-most such games in NFL history. Only **DREW BREES** (63 games), **TOM BRADY** (57), **BEN ROETHLISBERGER** (36) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (35) have more.

 RB JONATHAN TAYLOR had 1,004 scrimmage yards (861 rushing, 143 receiving) and four rushing touchdowns.

Has 4,643 scrimmage yards in 43 career games and is one of four players to average at least 105 scrimmage yards per game since 2020, along with **DERRICK HENRY** (129.2), **CHRISTIAN MCCAFFREY** (112.6) and **DALVIN COOK** (108.4).

 JACKSONVILLE (9-8) won AFC South for first time since 2017 and completed "worst to first" turnaround after finishing last in the division in 2021.

Became the fifth team since 1970 to win their division after finishing the previous season with the league's worst or tied for worst record, joining the 1975 **BALTIMORE COLTS**, 1999 **INDIANAPOLIS COLTS**, 2004 **SAN DIEGO CHARGERS** and 2008 **MIAMI DOLPHINS**.

Became the third team ever to make the postseason after winning no more than two of their first eight games of a season, joining the 1970 **CINCINNATI BENGALS** and 2020 **WASHINGTON FOOTBALL TEAM**.

Became the third team ever to make the postseason after winning no more than three of their first 10 games of a season, joining the 2014 **CAROLINA PANTHERS** and 2020 **WASHINGTON FOOTBALL TEAM**.

Became the third team ever to make the postseason after winning no more than four of their first 12 games of a season, joining the 2008 **SAN DIEGO CHARGERS** and 2014 **CAROLINA PANTHERS**.

 QB TREVOR LAWRENCE passed for 4,113 yards and had 30 touchdowns (25 passing, five rushing) with a 95.2 rating and became the third Jaguars quarterback ever with 4,000 passing yards in a season, joining BLAKE BORTLES (2015) and MARK BRUNELL (1996).

Became fourth player under the age of 24 with at least 4,000 passing yards, 25 touchdown passes and five rushing touchdowns in a season, joining **JOSH ALLEN** (2020), **JUSTIN HERBERT** (2020) and **DESHAUN WATSON** (2018).

Has 746 career completions and surpassed **KYLER MURRAY** (724) for the second-most by a player in his first two seasons in NFL history. Only **JUSTIN HERBERT** (839) had more.

In Week 14, at 23 years and 66 days old, became the youngest player in NFL history with at least 350 passing yards (368), three touchdown passes and one rushing touchdown in a game, surpassing **KYLER MURRAY** (23 years and 79 days old on October 25, 2020).

RB TRAVIS ETIENNE had 1,441 scrimmage yards (1,125 rushing, 316 receiving) and five
rushing touchdowns and became fourth Jaguars running back ever with at least 1,100 rushing
yards, joining LEONARD FOURNETTE, MAURICE JONES-DREW and FRED TAYLOR.

Had five games with at least 100 rushing yards, tied for the fourth-most in the NFL.

• TE **EVAN ENGRAM** ranked tied for third among tight ends in receptions (career-high 73) and fourth in receiving yards (career-high 766).

Is one of three tight ends (**TRAVIS KELCE** and **GEORGE KITTLE**) with at least 40 receptions in each of the past six seasons.

In Week 14, became the sixth tight end in NFL history with at least 10 receptions (11) for 150 yards (162) and two touchdowns in a game, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **SHANNON SHARPE** (October 6, 1996 and October 20, 2002) and **KELLEN WINSLOW SR**. (December 11, 1983) as well as **TODD CHRISTENSEN** (October 16, 1983), **TRAVIS KELCE** (December 2, 2018 and December 16, 2021) and **DARREN WALLER** (December 6, 2020).

JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS

• WR CHRISTIAN KIRK led team in receptions (career-high 84), receiving yards (career-high 1,108) and touchdown receptions (career-high eight) and became first Jaguar since 2015 (ALLEN ROBINSON) with at least 80 receptions and 1,100 receiving yards in a season.

Kirk and WR ZAY JONES (career-high 82 receptions) were one of three pairs of wide receiver teammates each with at least 80 receptions, along with Philadelphia's A.J. BROWN and DEVONTA SMITH and Seattle's DK METCALF and TYLER LOCKETT.

 LB FOYESADE OLUOKUN led NFL with 184 tackles and had career-high 12 tackles for loss and is the first player since 2000 to lead the league in tackles in consecutive seasons.

Had second-most tackles in single season since 2000, trailing only his total from the 2021 season with Atlanta (192).

- LB JOSH ALLEN had six sacks, 11 tackles for loss and tied for the third in the NFL with four forced fumbles.
- S RAYSHAWN JENKINS was one of three defensive backs (L'JARIUS SNEED and GRANT DELPIT) with at least 100 tackles (116) and 10 passes defensed (12).

Was one of five players with at least three interceptions (three) and three forced fumbles (three), joining JONATHAN JONES, JALEN RAMSEY, JUSTIN SIMMONS and L'JARIUS SNEED.

- LB DEVIN LLOYD ranked third among rookies with 115 tackles.
- LB TRAVON WALKER, the No. 1 overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft, joined AUNDRAY BRUCE, TOM COUSINEAU, STEVE EMTMAN and MYLES GARRETT as players selected first overall in the NFL Draft to record a sack in their first career games since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic.

Became the first player selected with the No. 1 overall pick in the NFL Draft to record both a sack and interception in his first-career game since 1982.

With CB DARIOUS WILLIAMS (16 passes defensed), CB TYSON CAMPBELL (15 passes defensed), S RAYSHAWN JENKINS (12 passes defensed) and CB ANDRE CISCO (10 passes defensed), JAGUARS were only team with four players each with at least 10 passes defensed this season.

Campbell and Williams were one of two pairs of teammates (Cleveland's **MARTIN EMERSON** and **DENZEL WARD**) each with at least 15 passes defensed.

 With CB TYSON CAMPBELL, CB ANDRE CISCO, S RAYSHAWN JENKINS and LB DEVIN LLOYD each having three interceptions, JAGUARS were only team with four players each having at least three interceptions this season.

KANSAS CITY CHIEFS

KANSAS CITY (14-3) won their seventh-consecutive AFC West division title, tying the 1973-79
 LOS ANGELES RAMS for the second-longest streak of division titles in NFL history. Only the
 2009-19 NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (11 consecutive seasons) had a longer streak.

Became the third team ever to record at least 12 regular-season wins in five consecutive seasons, joining the 2010-17 **NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS** (eight consecutive seasons) and 2003-09 **INDIANAPOLIS COLTS** (seven consecutive seasons).

Led the NFL in total offense (413.6 yards per game) and scoring offense (29.2 points per game).

In Week 1, became the sixth team in the Super Bowl era to win eight consecutive season-opening games, joining the 1966-81 **DALLAS COWBOYS** (16 consecutive wins), 1992-2002 **MIAMI DOLPHINS** (11), 2004-13 **NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS** (10), 1984-92 **CHICAGO BEARS** (nine) and 2003-10 **PITTSBURGH STEELERS** (eight).

HC ANDY REID became the third head coach in NFL history to record at least 10 regular-season
wins in eight consecutive seasons, joining BILL BELICHICK (17 consecutive seasons from 200319) and GEORGE SEIFERT (eight consecutive seasons from 1989-96).

Has 17 career seasons with at least 10 wins and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **TOM LANDRY** (16 seasons) for the third-most 10-win seasons by a head coach in NFL history. Only **BILL BELICHICK** (20 seasons) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **DON SHULA** (20) have more.

 QB PATRICK MAHOMES led the NFL with 5,250 passing yards and 41 touchdown passes, joining DREW BREES (2011-12) as the only players ever with two career seasons of 5,000 passing yards and 40 touchdown passes.

Joined **DREW BREES** (five seasons) and **TOM BRADY** (two) as the only players in NFL history to total at least 5,000 passing yards in multiple seasons.

Became the fourth quarterback all-time with four career seasons of 4,500 passing yards and 35 touchdown passes, joining **TOM BRADY** (five seasons), **DREW BREES** (four) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (four).

Became the fifth quarterback in NFL history to record at least 35 touchdown passes in four-ormore different seasons, joining **TOM BRADY** (six seasons), **AARON RODGERS** (six), **DREW BREES** (four) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (four).

Became the third player in NFL history with at least 25 touchdown passes in five of his first six career seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **PEYTON MANNING** (first six seasons) and **DAN MARINO** (five of first six).

Joined Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** as the only players in NFL history with at least 4,000 passing yards in five of their first six seasons.

Has 192 career touchdown passes and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (167 touchdown passes) for the second-most touchdown passes by a player in his first six season in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (196 touchdown passes) has more.

Has six career games with at least five touchdown passes, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (six) and **BEN ROETHLISBERGER** (six) for the fourth-most such games all-time.

KANSAS CITY CHIEFS

Only **DREW BREES** (11), **TOM BRADY** (nine) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (nine) have more.

Has 16 career games with at least four touchdown passes, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (16) for the most such games by a player in his first six career seasons in NFL history.

Has 41 career games with at least 300 passing yards and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (32 games) for the most such games by a player in his first six seasons in NFL history. Also surpassed Marino (37 games) for the most such games by a player in his first seven seasons in NFL history.

Has eight career games with at least 400 passing yards and three touchdown passes, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (eight) for the most such games by a player his first six seasons in NFL history.

Has 25 career games with at least 300 passing yards and three touchdown passes and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (23 games) for the most such games by a player in his first six seasons in NFL history.

In Week 15, had an 87.8 completion percentage (26 of 41), the highest single-game completion percentage among players with at least 40 attempts in NFL history.

Had 55 wins in his first 70 career starts, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **KEN STABLER** (55) for the second-most such wins by a quarterback in his first 70 career starts in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer **OTTO GRAHAM** (56 wins) had more.

TE TRAVIS KELCE has 10,344 career receiving yards and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer SHANNON SHARPE (10,060) for the fourth-most receiving yards by a tight end in NFL history.
 Only Pro Football Hall of Famer TONY GONZALEZ (15,127), JASON WITTEN (13,046) and ANTONIO GATES (11,841) have more.

Has 814 career receptions and is the fifth tight end in NFL history with at least 800 receptions, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer **TONY GONZALEZ** (1,325), **JASON WITTEN** (1,228), **ANTONIO GATES** (955) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **SHANNON SHARPE** (815).

Recorded 1,338 receiving yards in 2022, the fourth-most in a season by a tight end in NFL history.

Became the first tight end in NFL history with seven career seasons (2016-22) of at least 1,000 receiving yards.

Recorded 110 receptions in 2022, tied for the second-most in a season by a tight end in NFL history.

Has three career seasons with at least 100 receptions and three career seasons with at least 1,300 receiving yards, both the most by a tight end in NFL history. No other tight end all-time has more than one such season of each.

Has 35 career games with at least 100 receiving yards and surpassed **ROB GRONKOWSKI** (32 games) for the most by a tight end in NFL history.

KANSAS CITY CHIEFS

Has 97 career games with at least five receptions, and surpassed **ANTONIO GATES** (96 games) for the third-most such games by a tight end in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer **TONY GONZALEZ** (139 games) and **JASON WITTEN** (130) have more.

In Week 5, became the fourth tight end in NFL history with at least four touchdown receptions (four) in a single game, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **KELLEN WINSLOW SR**. (five touchdown receptions in Week 12, 1981) and **MIKE DITKA** (four in Week 5, 1963) as well as **JIMMIE GILES** (four in Week 7, 1985).

In Week 11, had three touchdown receptions and joined **TODD CHRISTENSEN** (1983) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **KELLEN WINSLOW SR**. (1982) as the only tight ends in the Super Bowl with multiple games of three-or-more touchdown receptions in a season.

Has 10 career games with multiple touchdown receptions and became the sixth tight end in the Super Bowl era with multiple touchdown receptions in 10-or-more career games, joining **ANTONIO GATES** (21 games), **ROB GRONKOWSI** (20), Pro Football Hall of Famer **TONY GONZALEZ** (18), **JIMMY GRAHAM** (17) and **JERRY SMITH** (10).

- In Week 7, WR **MECOLE HARDMAN** became the first wide receiver in the Super Bowl era to record at least two rushing touchdowns and one receiving touchdown in a single game.
- RB JERICK MCKINNON led all running backs with nine touchdown receptions, tied with Pro
 Football Hall of Famer MARSHALL FAULK (nine touchdown receptions in 2001), CHUCK
 FOREMAN (nine in 1975) and LEROY HOARD (nine in 1991) for the most by a running back in a

Passed for 3,522 yards in 2022 and joined Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** and **RUSSELL WILSON** as the only quarterbacks in NFL history with at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first nine seasons.

- In Week 17, QB **JARRETT STIDHAM** joined **MIKE WHITE** (Week 8, 2021) as the only quarterbacks since 1950 with at least 350 passing yards (365) and three touchdown passes in their first career start.
- RB JOSH JACOBS led the NFL with 2,053 scrimmage yards and 1,653 rush yards, joining Pro
 Football Hall of Famer MARCUS ALLEN (2,314 in 1985) as the only players in franchise history
 with at least 2,000 scrimmage yards in a season.

Ranked tied-fifth in the NFL with 12 rushing touchdowns and is one of two players (**DERRICK HENRY**) with at least nine rushing touchdowns in each of the past three seasons.

Is one of two players (**NICK CHUBB**) with at least 1,200 scrimmage yards and seven touchdowns in each of the past four seasons.

In Weeks 4-5 and 7 (around the team's Week 6 bye), became the fifth player since 2000 to register at least 140 rushing yards and a rushing touchdown in three consecutive games, joining **DERRICK HENRY** (2019), **LARRY JOHNSON** (2005), **ADRIAN PETERSON** (2012) and **RICKY WILLIAMS** (2002).

WR DAVANTE ADAMS led the NFL with 14 touchdown receptions and ranked third with 1,516 receiving yards, becoming the fifth player all-time to record at least 1,300 receiving yards and 10 touchdown receptions in four-or-more different seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers JERRY RICE (six seasons), MARVIN HARRISON (five), RANDY MOSS (five) and TERRELL OWENS (four).

Became the fourth player in NFL history with at least 10 touchdown receptions in at least six of

his first nine seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **JERRY RICE** (seven seasons), **MARVIN HARRISON** (six) and **RANDY MOSS** (six).

Had five games with at least 100 receiving yards and two touchdown receptions this season and is the fifth player in NFL history with five such games within a single season, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **RANDY MOSS** (seven games in 2007), **LANCE ALWORTH** (five in 1966), **DON HUTSON** (five in 1942) and **TERRELL OWENS** (five in 2001).

Has 769 receptions for 9,637 yards and 87 touchdowns since entering the NFL in 2014 and became the fourth player with at least 700 receptions and 80 receiving touchdowns in his first nine career seasons in NFL history, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers MARVIN HARRISON, CALVIN JOHNSON and JERRY RICE.

Surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **CALVIN JOHNSON** (83) for the fifth-most touchdown receptions by a player in his first nine seasons all-time.

Has three career overtime touchdowns, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** (three) for the most overtime touchdowns in NFL history.

Has 15 career games at least 100 receiving yards and two touchdown receptions, the fourth-most such games by a player in his first nine seasons who began his career in the Super Bowl era. Only Pro Football Hall of Famers **JERRY RICE** (18), **MARVIN HARRISON** (17) and **RANDY MOSS** (16) have more.

Has 14 career games with at least 10 receptions, 100 receiving yards and a touchdown reception, the most such games in NFL history.

Became sixth player with at least two touchdown receptions in 20-or-more games (21) within his first nine seasons in the Super Bowl era, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **JERRY RICE** (29 games), **TERRELL OWENS** (23), **MARVIN HARRISON** (21), **RANDY MOSS** (21) and **CRIS CARTER** (20).

• DE MAXX CROSBY led the NFL with a career-high 22 tackles for loss and had a career-best 12.5 sacks, the third-most by a Raider in a season since 2000.

Was one of four players with at least 10 sacks and three forced fumbles (three).

- Crosby and LB DENZEL PERRYMAN (14 tackles for loss) were the only pair of AFC teammates each with at least 14 tackles for loss.

Has 94 career touchdown passes and surpassed **ANDREW LUCK** (86) for the second-most touchdown passes by a player in his first three seasons in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (98) has more.

Has 45 career games with a touchdown pass and surpassed with Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (44 games) for the most such games with at least one touchdown pass by a player in his first three seasons in NFL history.

Has 16 career games with at least three touchdown passes and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famers **PATRICK MAHOMES** (15 games) for the second-most such games by a player in his first three career seasons in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (18 games) has more.

 RB AUSTIN EKELER led the NFL with 18 touchdowns (13 rushing, five receiving), joining TODD GURLEY (2017-18) as the only players since 2010 with at least 18 touchdowns in consecutive seasons.

Joined **PRIEST HOLMES** (2002-03) as the only undrafted players with at least 1,500 scrimmage yards and 15 touchdowns in consecutive seasons in the common-draft era.

Led all running backs with a career-high 107 receptions tied with **CHRISTIAN MCCAFFREY** (107 receptions in 2018) for the second-most receptions by a running back in a season in NFL history.

Has 7,175 career scrimmage yards and joined **ARIAN FOSTER** (8,350 scrimmage yards) and **PRIEST HOLMES** (7,143) as the only undrafted players with at least 7,000 scrimmage yards in their first six seasons in the common-draft era.

Became the fourth undrafted player in the common-draft era to have at least 10 touchdowns in three-or-more different seasons, joining **ARIAN FOSTER** (four seasons), **ANTONIO GATES** (four) and **PRIEST HOLMES** (four).

In Weeks 6-7, became the seventh running back all-time to record at least 10 receptions in consecutive games, joining LARRY CENTERS (Week 17, 1995 and Week 1, 1996), MATT FORTE (Weeks 5-6, 2014), CLARK GAINES (Weeks 2-3, 1980), LIONEL JAMES (Weeks 10-11, 1985), TY MONTGOMERY (Weeks 6-7, 2016) and JAMES WILDER (Weeks 13-14, 1984).

- WR MIKE WILLIAMS (895 receiving yards), WR JOSHUA PALMER (769), WR KEENAN
 ALLEN (752) and RB AUSTIN EKELER (722) became the first quartet of teammates each with
 at least 700 receiving yards in a season since 2018.
- WR KEENAN ALLEN is one of five wide receivers with at least 750 receiving yards in each of the
 past six seasons.
- LB **DRUE TRANQUILL** was one of two players with at least 125 tackles (144) and five sacks (5.5) this season and was one of eight players with at least five tackles in all 17 games.
- LB KHALIL MACK led the team with eight sacks and is one of two players (CAMERON JORDAN) with at least six sacks in each of the past eight seasons.

- QB MATTHEW STAFFORD has 52,082 career passing yards and tied DREW BREES (183 games) as the fastest player ever to reach 50,000 career passing yards.
- WR COOPER KUPP had 75 receptions for 812 yards and seven total touchdowns (six receiving, one rushing) in nine games and is one of three players with at least 75 receptions in each of the past four seasons.

Became the sixth player in NFL history with at least 20 games (20) with at least five receptions, 100 receiving yards and a touchdown reception in his first six career seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers RANDY MOSS (28 games), JERRY RICE (22), LANCE ALWORTH (21) and MARVIN HARRISON (20) as well as STERLING SHARPE (20).

From 2020 to 2022, had at least five receptions in 23 consecutive games, tied with **DEANDRE HOPKINS** (23 consecutive games from 2018-20) for the second-most consecutive games with at least five receptions in NFL history. Only **ANTONIO BROWN** (36 games from 2013-15) had a longer such streak.

Had 49 receptions in his first five games and surpassed **T.J. HOUSHMANDZADEH** (47 receptions in 2007) and **ADAM THIELEN** (47 in 2018) for the most receptions by a player in his team's first five games of a season in NFL history.

- TE **TYLER HIGBEE** ranked second among NFC tight ends with a career-high 72 receptions and fourth with 620 receiving yards.
- DL **AARON DONALD** had 10 tackles for loss in 11 games this season and ranks fourth among all active players with 160 career tackles for loss.

Is the only player with at least 10 tackles for loss in each of the past nine seasons and is one of two with at least five sacks in each of the past nine seasons.

- LB **BOBBY WAGNER** recorded his 11th consecutive season with at least 100 tackles (140) and leads all players with 1,517 tackles since entering the league in 2012.
- LB **LEONARD FLOYD** had a team-high nine sacks and is one of four players with at least nine sacks in each of the past three seasons.
- DB JALEN RAMSEY ranked second in the league with a career-high 18 passes defensed.

Became first player since **CARY WILLIAMS** (2011-12) with at least 75 tackles and 15 passes defensed in consecutive seasons.

MIAMI DOLPHINS

• **MIAMI DOLPHINS** (9-8) qualified for the postseason for the first time since 2016 and finished with an above .500 record for the third consecutive season, the first time the franchise has done so since 1997-2003 (seven consecutive seasons).

Ranked fourth in the NFL in rushing defense (103 yards allowed per game).

In Week 2, overcame a 21-point fourth-quarter deficit to defeat Baltimore, 42-38, becoming the first team to do so since Philadelphia overcame a 21-point deficit to defeat the New York Giants in Week 15 of the 2010 season.

• QB **TUA TAGOVAILOA** led the league with a 105.5 passer rating and recorded a career-high 3,548 passing yards and 25 touchdown passes in 13 games.

In Week 2, at 24 years and 200 days old, became the third-youngest player ever with six touchdown passes in a single game, trailing only **PATRICK MAHOMES** (22 years and 364 days old on September 16, 2018 and 23 years and 63 days old on November 19, 2018) and **MITCH TRUBISKY** (24 years and 41 days old on September 30, 2018).

In Week 2, also became the fourth-youngest player in NFL history with at least 450 passing yards (469) and five touchdown passes in a single game, trailing only **PATRICK MAHOMES** (23 years and 63 days old on November 19, 2018), **MATTHEW STAFFORD** (23 years and 328 days old on January 1, 2012) and **JARED GOFF** (23 years and 348 days old on September 27, 2018).

From Weeks 8-10, became the second player in NFL history with at least 275 passing yards, three touchdown passes and a passer rating of 135-or-higher in three consecutive games, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer **KURT WARNER** (Weeks 3-5, 1999).

 WR TYREEK HILL ranked second in the NFL with 119 catches and 1,710 receiving yards, both single-season franchise records, with seven touchdowns (six receiving, one rushing).

Joined Pro Football Hall of Famer **RANDY MOSS** as the only wide receivers in NFL history with at least seven touchdowns in each of his first seven seasons.

Became the fifth player in NFL history to record at least six touchdown receptions in each of his first seven seasons, joining **LARRY FITZGERALD** and Pro Football Hall of Famers **MARVIN HARRISON**, **DON HUTSON** and **RANDY MOSS**.

Has 76 total touchdowns (63 receiving, seven rushing, four punt-returns, one kickoff-return and one fumble-recovery) and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **LANCE ALWORTH** (75 touchdowns) for the third-most touchdowns by a wide receiver in his first seven seasons in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famers **JERRY RICE** (97 touchdowns) and **RANDY MOSS** (91) had more.

Has nine career games with at least 10 receptions and 150 receiving yards, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **TIM BROWN** (nine) for the fifth-most such games in NFL history. Only **ANTONIO BROWN** (10 games), **ANDRE JOHNSON** (10), **JULIO JONES** (10) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **JERRY RICE** (10) have more.

Had four games with at least 10 receptions and 150 receiving yards this season (Weeks 2, 4, 6 and 8), tied with Pro Football Hall of Famers **TIM BROWN** (1997), **CALVIN JOHNSON** (2012)

MIAMI DOLPHINS

and **JERRY RICE** (1995) as well as **ANTONIO BROWN** (2017) for the most such games in a single season in NFL history.

Hill had 1,379 receiving yards through 12 games, the third-most receiving yards by a player in his team's first 12 games of a season in the Super Bowl era. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer **CALVIN JOHNSON** (1,428 receiving yards in 2012) and **TORRY HOLT** (1,387 in 2003) had more.

Hill, who had six games with at least 125 receiving yards through Week 13, is the fourth player since 1970 with at least 125 receiving yards in six-or-more of his team's first 12 games of a season, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer **CALVIN JOHNSON** (seven in 2012), **JOSH GORDON** (six in 2013) and **JULIO JONES** (six in 2015).

Waddle recorded 75 catches for a career-high 1,356 receiving yards and eight touchdowns.

Has four career games with at least 10 receptions, tied with **ODELL BECKHAM JR**. (four games) and **CHRISTIAN MCCAFFREY** (four) for the most such games by a player in his first two seasons in NFL history.

Had 125 receptions in his first 20 career games and surpassed **ANQUAN BOLDIN** (121 receptions) and **MICHAEL THOMAS** (120) for the second-most receptions by a player in his first 20 career games in NFL history. Only **ODELL BECKHAM JR**. (141) had more.

Hill and Waddle combined for 3,066 receiving yards this season and surpassed Denver's EMMANUEL SANDERS and DEMARYIUS THOMAS (3,023 receiving yards in 2014) for the third-most combined receiving yards by a pair of teammates in a season in NFL history. Only Detroit's HERMAN MOORE and BRETT PERRIMAN (3,174 in 1995) and the St. Louis Rams' TORRY HOLT and Pro Football Hall of Famer ISAAC BRUCE (3,106 in 2000) had more.

In Week 2, Hill (11 catches for 190 yards and two touchdowns) and Waddle (11 catches for 171 yards and two touchdowns) became the first pair of teammates in NFL history to record at least 10 receptions, 150 receiving yards and two touchdown receptions in the same game.

- TE MIKE GESICKI ranked tied-third among AFC tight ends with five touchdown receptions and is
 one of four tight ends with at least five touchdown receptions in at least three of the past four
 seasons.
- CB XAVIEN HOWARD is one of four players with at least 12 passes defensed in each of the past four seasons.

Leads the NFL with 28 interceptions since 2017.

MINNESOTA VIKINGS

MINNESOTA VIKINGS (13-4) won the NFC North division title for the first time since 2017.

Had 11 one-score wins (eight points or fewer) this season, the most such wins by a team in a season in NFL history.

In Week 15, recorded the largest comeback victory in NFL history, overcoming a 33-0 deficit to defeat Indianapolis, 39-36, in overtime to clinch the NFC North for the first time since 2017.

- HC KEVIN O'CONNELL became the fifth head coach since 2000 to win eight of his first nine games, joining JIM CALDWELL (2009) and JIM HARBAUGH (2011).
- QB KIRK COUSINS ranked fourth in the league with 4,547 passing yards and tied for fifth with 29 touchdown passes.

Became the fifth player ever to record at least 25 touchdown passes in at least eight consecutive seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (13 seasons), **DREW BREES** (11), **PHILIP RIVERS** (11) and **TOM BRADY** (10).

Reached 3,000 completions in 132 career games, tied with **DEREK CARR** (132 games) for the third-fewest games to reach the mark in NFL history. Only **MATTHEW STAFFORD** (125 games) and **MATT RYAN** (130) reached the mark in fewer games.

• WR **JUSTIN JEFFERSON** led the league with 128 receptions, the seventh-most receptions in a season in NFL history, for 1,809 receiving yards.

Became the sixth player in NFL history with at least 1,800 receiving yards in a season, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer **CALVIN JOHNSON** (1,964 receiving yards in 2012), **COOPER KUPP** (1,947 in 2021), **JULIO JONES** (1,871 in 2015), Pro Football Hall of Famer **JERRY RICE** (1,848 in 1995) and **ANTONIO BROWN** (1,834 in 2015).

Became the third player ever with at least 1,600 receiving yards in consecutive seasons, joining **ANTONIO BROWN** (2014-15) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **CALVIN JOHNSON** (2011-12).

Became the first player in NFL history with at least 1,400 receiving yards in each of his first three career seasons.

Had 10 games with at least 100 receiving yards this season, tied for the fourth-most such games in a single season in NFL history. Only **COOPER KUPP** (11 in 2021) and Pro Football Hall of Famers **CALVIN JOHNSON** (11 in 2012) and **MICHAEL IRVIN** (11 in 1995) had more.

Has 24 career games with at least 100 receiving yards, the most by a player in his first three career seasons and most by a player in his first four career seasons in NFL history.

Has eight career games with at least 150 receiving yards and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famers **LANCE ALWORTH** (six games) and **RANDY MOSS** (six) for the most-ever by a player in his first three seasons.

Has six career games with at least 150 receiving yards and a touchdown reception, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **LANCE ALWORTH** (six) for the most such games by a player in his first three seasons in NFL history.

MINNESOTA VIKINGS

Has five career games with at least 175 receiving yards, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **LANCE ALWORTH** (five games) for the most such games by a player in his first three seasons in NFL history.

Has 4,825 career receiving yards and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **RANDY MOSS** (4,163 receiving yards) for the most receiving yards by a player in his first three seasons in NFL history.

Reached 4,000 career receiving yards in 42 career games, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **LANCE ALWORTH** (42 games) and **ODELL BECKHAM JR**. (42) for the fewest games to reach 4,000 career receiving yards in NFL history.

Has 324 career receptions and became the third player all-time with at least 300 receptions in his first three seasons, joining **MICHAEL THOMAS** (321 receptions) and **CHRISTIAN MCCAFFREY** (303).

From Weeks 14-16, became the sixth player ever with at least 10 receptions and 100 receiving yards in at least three consecutive games, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer CALVIN JOHNSON (four consecutive games in 2012), **KEENAN ALLEN** (three in 2017), **ANDRE JOHNSON** (three in 2008), **BRETT PERRIMAN** (three in 1995) and **MICHAEL THOMAS** (three in 2019).

- RB **DALVIN COOK** led team with 1,173 rushing yards and 10 touchdowns (eight rushing, two receiving) and is one of two players to record at least 1,300 scrimmage yards in each of the past four seasons.
- WR ADAM THIELEN had 70 catches for 716 receiving yards and six touchdowns, joining ANTONIO GATES (12 seasons) and ROD SMITH (seven seasons) as the only undrafted players in the common-draft era to record at least five touchdown receptions in six different seasons.

Became the fourth undrafted player since 1967 with at least 50 career touchdown receptions (55), joining **ANTONIO GATES** (116 touchdown receptions), **ROD SMITH** (68) and **WES WELKER** (50).

• TE **T.J. HOCKENSON** recorded career highs with 86 receptions and 914 receiving yards, both the second-most among tight ends, and tied his career high with six touchdown receptions.

Is one of two tight ends with at least 60 receptions in each of the past three seasons.

- LB **DANIELLE HUNTER** (10.5 sacks) and LB **ZA'DARIUS SMITH** (10) were one of two linebacker duos in the league to each record at least 10 sacks.
- CB PATRICK PETERSON was one of two players with at least 15 passes defensed (15) and five interceptions (5).
- S HARRISON SMITH was one of two players with at least 85 tackles, 10 passes defensed and five interceptions.
- Peterson and Smith were the only pair of teammates to each record five interceptions. They each have 34 career interceptions, tied for the second-most among active players.

MINNESOTA VIKINGS

 K GREG JOSPEH converted five game-winning field goals kicked within the final two minutes of regulation or in overtime, tied with DANIEL CARLSON (2021) and JAN STENERUD (1983) for the most in a single season since 1970.

In Week 16, converted the game-winning 61-yard field goal as time expired against the Giants, tied with **JAKE ELLIOTT** (61 yards on September 24, 2017) for the fourth-longest game-winning field goal ever with no time remaining in the fourth quarter or in overtime. Only **JUSTIN TUCKER** (66 yards on September 26, 2021), **TOM DEMPSEY** (63 yards on November 8, 1970) and **MATT BRYANT** (62 yards on October 22, 2006) had longer game-winners.

NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS

- NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS led the league with seven defensive touchdowns and ranked tied for second with 30 takeaways.
 - From Weeks 14-17, Joined the 2002 **TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS** (Weeks 2-5) as the only teams since 2000 with a defensive touchdown in four consecutive games within a single season.
- HC **BILL BELICHICK** has 329 combined regular-season and postseason wins, the second-most by a head coach all-time. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer **DON SHULA** (347 combined regular-season and postseason wins) has more.
- RB RHAMONDRE STEVENSON had career-high 1,461 scrimmage yards (1,040 rushing, 421 receiving) and six touchdowns (five rushing, one receiving).

Became the fifth Patriot in the Super Bowl era with at least five rushing touchdowns in each of his first two seasons.

Ranked fourth among running backs with a career-high 69 receptions, the fourth-most ever by a New England running back in a single season.

- LB **MATTHEW JUDON** ranked tied-fourth in the NFL with a career-high 15.5 sacks and is one of four players with at least 12 sacks in each of the past two seasons.
- LB **JOSH UCHE** recorded a career-high 11.5 sacks and nine tackles for loss with two forced fumbles. Had two games with three sacks this season.
- Judon and Uche were one of two linebacker duos in the league to each record at least 10 sacks.
 - In Week 9, Judon and Uche became the first pair of teammates each with at least three sacks in the same game since **AARON DONALD** and **TROY REEDER** in Week 5 of the 2020 season with the Los Angeles Rams.
- DB MARCUS JONES became the fourth player in NFL history with an interception-return for a touchdown, punt-return for a touchdown and touchdown reception in a season, joining FRANK BACON (1920), Pro Football Hall of Famer BILL DUDLEY (1947) and TOMMY HARMON (1947).
 - In Week 11, recorded an 84-yard punt-return touchdown with five seconds remaining and became the sixth player to record a game-winning punt-return touchdown in the final two minutes of regulation or in overtime since 1970, joining **PATRICK PETERSON** (November 6, 2011), **DESEAN JACKSON** (December 19, 2010), **BRIAN WESTBROOK** (October 19, 2003), **TAMARICK VANOVER** (October 9, 1995) and **WALTER STANLEY** (November 27, 1986).

In Week 11, his punt-return touchdown with five seconds remaining marked the second-latest game-winning punt-return touchdown in regulation since 1970, trailing only **DESEAN JACKSON** (no time remaining on December 19, 2010).

 DB KYLE DUGGER led the league with three defensive touchdowns, joining TROY HILL (2020), EDDIE JACKSON (2018), MARCUS PETERS (2019) and DARIUS SLAY (2021) as the only players since 2015 with three defensive touchdowns in a season since 2015.

NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS

- In Week 9, DB **JONATHAN JONES** became the third player since 2000 with an interception-return for a touchdown and a blocked punt in the same game, joining **PATRICK CHUNG** (Week 4, 2010) and **CHAD WILLIAMS** (Week 13, 2002).
- DB **DEVIN MCCOURTY** tied for the team lead with four interceptions and leads all active players with 35 career interceptions.

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS

• RB **ALVIN KAMARA** totaled 57 receptions, 1,387 scrimmage yards (897 rushing, 490 receiving) and four touchdowns (two rushing, two receiving).

Became fourth player since 2000 with at least 1,300 scrimmage yards in each of his first six seasons, joining MATT FORTE, CHRIS JOHNSON and Pro Football Hall of Famer LADAINIAN TOMLINSON.

Has 430 career receptions and joined **CHRISTIAN MCCAFFREY** (442) and **ROGER CRAIG** (434) as the only running backs with at least 400 receptions in their first six seasons in NFL history.

Is one of seven players all-time with at least 10 games (10) with both a rushing and receiving touchdown, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers MARSHALL FAULK (15 games), LENNY MOORE (12) and JIM BROWN (11) as well as BRIAN WESTBROOK (12), CHRISTIAN MCCAFFREY (11) and AUSTIN EKELER (10).

 WR CHRIS OLAVE led all rookies with 69.5 receiving yards per game, ranked second in receiving yards (1,042) and tied for second in receptions (72).

Became the third New Orleans rookie ever with at least 1,000 receiving yards, joining **MARQUES COLSTON** (1,038 receiving yards in 2006) and **MICHAEL THOMAS** (1,137 in 2016).

Led all rookies with 12 games with 50-or-more receiving yards, tied for the third-most such games ever by a rookie, trailing only **MICHAEL CLAYTON** (14 games in 2004) and **TERRY GLENN** (13 in 1996).

• WR **RASHID SHAHEED** ranked third in receiving average (17.4 yards) among players with at least 25 receptions.

Became second player since 1991 (MARQUISE BROWN) to score a scrimmage touchdown of at least 40 yards on each of his first two career offensive touches.

 TE TAYSOM HILL had a career-high 575 rushing yards and career high tying nine touchdowns (seven rushing, two receiving), while adding 240 passing yards and two touchdown passes and nine receptions for 77 yards.

In Week 5, became the third player ever to record at least 100 rushing yards (112), three rushing touchdowns and a touchdown pass in a single game, joining **RONNIE BROWN** (September 21, 2008) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** (September 25, 2005).

Has 23 career rushing touchdowns, nine career touchdown receptions and 10 career touchdown passes and joined Pro Football Hall of Famer **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** as the only players since 2000 with at least 20 rushing touchdowns, five touchdown receptions and five touchdown passes in their career.

 TE JUWAN JOHNSON ranked tied for third among tight ends with career-high seven touchdown receptions.

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS

- DE CAMERON JORDAN had 8.5 sacks and became the sixth player since 1982 to record at least seven sacks in 11 consecutive seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers REGGIE WHITE (14 consecutive seasons), CHRIS DOLEMAN (13), JOHN RANDLE (12) and DERRICK THOMAS (11), as well as ROBERT MATHIS (11).
- LB **DEMARIO DAVIS** led team with 109 tackles and had 10 tackles for loss and is the only player with at least 100 tackles and 10 tackles for loss in each of the past six seasons.

Had career-high 6.5 sacks and added six passes defensed and is one of three linebackers with at least five passes defensed in each of the past four seasons, along with **BOBBY WAGNER** and **T.J. WATT**.

NEW YORK GIANTS

• **NEW YORK GIANTS** (9-7-1) clinched first playoff berth since 2016.

In Week 7, became the third team in NFL history to register six wins, each by a final score margin of eight-or-fewer points, within their first seven games of a season, joining the 2000 **MINNESOTA VIKINGS** and 1988 **NEW ORLEANS SAINTS**.

In Weeks 1, 5 and 6, overcame deficits of at least 10 points to win and became the fourth team ever to record three such wins within their first six games of a season, joining the 1993 **PHILADELPHIA EAGLES**, 1981 **CINCINNATI BENGALS** and 1980 **MIAMI DOLPHINS**.

Ranked fourth in rushing yards per game (148.2) and had four games with at least 200 yards rushing, tied for second-most in the NFL this season.

• QB **DANIEL JONES** had career highs in passing yards (3,205), completion percentage (67.2), passer rating (92.5), rushing yards (708) and rushing touchdowns (seven) while throwing for his fewest interceptions (five).

Was one of two quarterbacks this season with at least 15 touchdown passes (15) and five-or-fewer interceptions (JIMMY GAROPPOLO).

Ranked fifth among quarterbacks in rushing yards and tied for third in rushing touchdowns.

• RB **SAQUON BARKLEY** ranked fourth in NFL with a career-high 1,312 rushing yards and fifth among running backs with 1,650 scrimmage yards and had his second-career season with at least 10 rushing touchdowns (10).

Had 10 games with a rushing touchdown, tied for the most in the NFL this season.

- WR **DARIUS SLAYTON** led the team with 724 receiving yards, his third-career season with at least 700 yards in his four-year career.
- DL **DEXTER LAWRENCE** set career highs in tackles (68) and sacks (7.5).
- LB KAYVON THIBODEAUX recorded six tackles for loss and four sacks and was only rookie with two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.
- S JULIAN LOVE ranked fourth among defensive backs with a career-high 116 tackles.

NEW YORK JETS

• **NEW YORK JETS** ranked fourth in scoring defense (18.6 points per game allowed) and total defense (311.1 yards per game allowed)

In Week 2, became the first team to overcome a deficit of at least 13 points inside of the final two minutes of regulation to win since Chicago overcame a 14-point deficit to defeat Cleveland in overtime in Week 8 of the 2001 season.

QB MIKE WHITE became the second quarterback in NFL history with multiple games of 300
passing yards, three touchdown passes and a completion percentage of 75-or-higher in his first
four career starts, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer KURT WARNER.

Became the fifth player ever with at least 350 passing yards in at least two of his first five career starts, joining **CAM NEWTON** (three games), **JEFF BLAKE** (two), **KIRK COUSINS** (two) and **JIM MILLER** (two).

• RB **BREECE HALL** had 681 scrimmage yards (463 rushing, 218 receiving) and five touchdowns (four rushing, one receiving) in seven games.

In Week 5, recorded 197 scrimmage yards (100 receiving, 97 rushing) and became the first rookie since 2007 (**PIERRE THOMAS**) with at least 100 receiving yards and 95 rushing yards in the same game.

In Week 5, recorded a 79-yard reception in the first quarter, marking the seventh-longest reception by a rookie running back since 1970 and longest since **EZEKIEL ELLIOTT** (83-yard touchdown reception) on November 13, 2016.

- RB **ZONOVAN KNIGHT** joined **PHILLIP LINDSAY** (2018) as the only undrafted players in the common-draft era with at least 100 scrimmage yards in each of their first two career games.
- WR GARRETT WILSON led all rookies and set rookie franchise records with 83 receptions for 1,103 receiving yards.

Had at least 75 receiving yards in eight games this season, the most such games of all rookies.

Was one of two rookies (**CHRISTIAN WATSON**) with two games of at least two touchdown catches.

- DL QUINNEN WILLIAMS had career highs in sacks (12) and tackles for loss (12), the first Jets player with at least 10 sacks since MUHAMMAD WILKERSON (12 sacks in 2015).
- LB C.J. MOSLEY led team with 159 tackles and is one of four players with at least 150 tackles in each of the past two seasons, along with JORDYN BROOKS, FOYESADE OLUOKUN and ROQUAN SMITH.
- CB **SAUCE GARDNER** led the league with 20 passes defensed, most by a rookie since 2015 (**RONALD DARBY**, 21 and **MARCUS PETERS**, 26).

Became the first player since 2000 to record at least one pass defensed in each of his first seven career games. He was also one of four players to record a pass defense in at least 12 games this season.

PHILADELPHIA EAGLES

 PHILADELPHIA (14-3) earned the No. 1 seed in the NFC and clinched the NFC East for the first time since 2019.

Recorded 70 sacks, tied with the 1987 **CHICAGO BEARS** (70 sacks) for the third-most sacks by a team in a season in NFL history. Only the 1984 **CHICAGO BEARS** (72 sacks) and 1989 **MINNESOTA VIKINGS** (71) had more.

Became the first team with four players each with at least 10 sacks in a single season since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic.

Recorded 32 rushing touchdowns, tied with the 2003 **KANSAS CITY CHIEFS** (32 rushing touchdowns) and 2006 **SAN DIEGO CHARGERS** (32) for the second-most rushing touchdowns by a team in a season in the Super Bowl era. Only the 1976 **PITTSBURGH STEELERS** (33 rushing touchdowns) had more.

 QB JALEN HURTS recorded a career-high 3,701 passing yards with 22 touchdown passes and added 760 rushing yards and 13 rushing touchdowns, tied for second-most in the NFL this season.

Became the fourth quarterback ever with at least 3,000 passing yards, 20 touchdown passes and 10 rushing touchdowns in a single season, joining **KYLER MURRAY** (2020), **CAM NEWTON** (2011 and 2015) and **KORDELL STEWART** (1997).

Surpassed **STEVE GROGAN** (12 rushing touchdowns in 1976) and **CAM NEWTON** (12 in 2020) for the second-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback in a season in NFL history. Only Newton (14 in 2011) had more.

Became the first quarterback ever to record at least 10 rushing touchdowns in consecutive seasons.

Joined **CAM NEWTON** (2011, 2015 and 2020) as the only quarterbacks ever with at least 10 rushing touchdowns in multiple seasons.

From Week 15, 2021 to Week 9, 2022, won 11 consecutive starts, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (11 consecutive wins in 1999) and **DAK PRESCOTT** (11 in 2016) for the third-longest winning streak by a starting quarterback under the age of 25 since 1990. Only **BEN ROETHLISBERGER** (15 consecutive wins from 2004-05) and **LAMAR JACKSON** (13 consecutive wins from 2019-20) have longer streaks.

Has eight career games with at least two rushing touchdowns and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famers OTTO GRAHAM (seven games) and STEVE YOUNG (seven), as well as JACK KEMP (seven) and STEVE MCNAIR (seven), for the second-most such games by a quarterback all-time. Only CAM NEWTON (10 games) has more.

Has 26 career rushing touchdowns and surpassed **JOSH ALLEN** (25) for the second-most by a quarterback in his first three career seasons in the Super Bowl era, trailing only **CAM NEWTON** (28).

In Week 15, became the third quarterback ever with at least 300 passing yards (315) and three rushing touchdowns in a single game, joining **DAK PRESCOTT** (September 20, 2020) and **JACK KEMP** (October 26, 1963).

PHILADELPHIA EAGLES

Became the fourth quarterback in NFL history with two career games of at least three rushing touchdowns, joining **DUANTE CULPEPPER**, **JOHNNY LUJACK** and **TOBIN ROTE**.

- RB MILES SANDERS had career highs in rushing yards (1,269) and rushing touchdowns (11), the most rushing touchdowns by a Philadelphia running back since LESEAN MCCOY (17 rushing touchdowns) in 2011.
- WR A.J. BROWN ranked fourth with a career-high and a single-season franchise-record 1,496 receiving yards.

Had career-high 88 receptions and tied his career high with 11 touchdown receptions.

Has seven career games with at least 150 receiving yards, the fifth-most such games by a player in his first four career seasons in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famers **LANCE ALWORTH** (10 games), **RANDY MOSS** (eight) and **JERRY RICE** (eight) as well as **JUSTIN JEFFERSON** (eight) have more.

In Week 8, became the first player since **DREW BENNETT** (December 5, 2004) with three touchdown receptions of 25-or-more yards in the first half of a game.

WR DEVONTA SMITH recorded 95 receptions for 1,196 yards and seven touchdowns.

Had 13 games with at least 5 receptions, tied for the third-most in the NFL.

Smith and Brown were only pair of teammates each with 85 receptions and 1,100 receiving yards.

LB HAASON REDDICK tied for second in the league with a career-high 16 sacks.

Became the first player to record at least 10 sacks in three consecutive seasons with three different teams since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic.

- DE BRANDON GRAHAM (11 sacks), DT JAVON HARGRAVE (11) and DE JOSH SWEAT (110) each their career high for sacks in 2022.
- LB T.J. EDWARDS ranked tied for fifth with 159 tackles and was one of three players with at least 150 tackles and 10 tackles for loss, along with ZAIRE FRANKLIN and FOYESADE OLUOKUN.
- CB DARIUS SLAY had 14 passes defensed this season and leads the NFL with 133 passes defensed since entering the league in 2013.
- CB **JAMES BRADBERRY** ranked third with 17 passes defensed and is the only player with at least 10 passes defensed in each of the past seven seasons.
- S C.J. GARDNER-JOHNSON tied for the league-lead with six interceptions.

From Weeks 5-10 (Week 7 Bye), became sixth player in past 10 seasons (2013-22) to record an interception in five consecutive games.

PITTSBURGH STEELERS

- PITTSBURGH (9-8) secured a .500-or-better record for the 19th consecutive season, tied with the NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (2001-19) for the second-longest such streak in NFL history. Only the DALLAS COWBOYS (21 consecutive seasons from 1965-85) have a longer streak.
- HC MIKE TOMLIN finished with a winning record for the 16th consecutive season, tying GEORGE HALAS for the third-longest such streak in NFL history.

Has 163 career wins, trailing only Pro Football Hall of Famer DON SHULA (165) for the most wins by a head coach in his first 16 seasons in NFL history.

 QB KENNY PICKETT led all rookies with 2,404 passing yards and had three rushing touchdowns.

In Weeks 16-17, became the first rookie in NFL history to have a game-winning touchdown pass in the final minute of the fourth quarter in consecutive games.

In Week 16, recorded the game-winning touchdown pass with 46 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter to rookie WR **GEORGE PICKENS**, the fourth time in the Super Bowl era that a rookie quarterback had a game-winning touchdown pass to a rookie receiver in the final two minutes of regulation.

In Week 4, became first quarterback ever to record multiple rushing touchdowns in his first career game.

RB NAJEE HARRIS had 1,263 scrimmage yards (1,034 rushing, 229 receiving) and 10 touchdowns (seven rushing, three receiving).

Is one of two running backs with at least 1,200 scrimmage yards and 10 touchdowns in each of the past two seasons, along with **AUSTIN EKELER**.

Had nine games with at least one touchdown, tied for the third-most among AFC running backs.

• WR **DIONTAE JOHNSON** led team with 86 receptions and 882 receiving yards.

Has 37 games with at least five receptions since 2020, tied with **TRAVIS KELCE** (37) for the third-most in the league in that span.

- WR GEORGE PICKENS ranked tied for second among rookies with 72 receptions and fourth among rookies with 866 receiving yards.
- TE **PAT FREIERMUTH** ranked fourth among AFC tight ends with 63 receptions and 732 receiving yards.

Joined **KEITH JACKSON** (1988-89) as the only tight ends with at least 60 receptions in their first two seasons in NFL history.

• LB **T.J. WATT** had eight tackles for loss, 5.5 sacks, five passes defensed and two interceptions in 10 games this season.

Became the first player since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic, to record at least 70 sacks (77.5) and five interceptions (six) in his first six career seasons.

PITTSBURGH STEELERS

Became the third-fastest player (84 games) since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic, to reach 75 career sacks, surpassing Pro Football Hall of Famer **BRUCE SMITH** (85 games). Only Pro Football Hall of Famer **REGGIE WHITE** (65 games) and **J.J. WATT** (82) reached the mark in fewer games.

- DT CAMERON HEYWARD was one of two defensive linemen (MAXX CROSBY) with at least 70 tackles (74) and 10 sacks (10.5).
- LB ALEX HIGHSMITH ranked fourth in the AFC with a career-high 14.5 sacks
- S MINKAH FITZPATRICK ranked tied for the league lead with six interceptions.

Became the fourth player ever with at least one interception-return for a touchdown in four of his first five career seasons, joining **NATE CLEMENTS**, Pro Football Hall of Famer **KEN HOUSTON** and **DEION JONES**.

SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS

• SAN FRANCISCO (13-4) clinched the NFC West for the first time since 2019.

Led the NFL in total defense (300.6 yards per game allowed), scoring defense (16.3 points per game allowed), points margin (+173) and turnover margin (+13), ranked tied for first in interceptions (20) and ranked second in rushing defense (77.7 yards allowed per game).

Was one of two teams (**PHILADELPHIA**) to rank in the top five in both total offense (365.6 yards per game) and total defense.

Became the 13th team in the Super Bowl era and first since 2019 (**BALTIMORE**) to end the regular-season on a winning streak of at least 10 games (10).

- QB **JIMMY GAROPPOLO** had third-highest passer rating (103.0) among qualified passers.
- QB **BROCK PURDY** led the NFL in passer rating (112.0) and tied for first in touchdown passes (13) over the final six weeks of the season (Weeks 13-18).

Became the third rookie quarterback ever to win each of his first five career starts, joining **BEN ROETHLISBERGER** (won first 13 starts in 2004) and **MIKE KRUCZEK** (first six in 1968).

Became the second rookie in the Super Bowl era with at least two touchdown passes in six consecutive games and the first since **JUSTIN HERBERT** (seven consecutive games in 2020).

Joined Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** as the only quarterbacks since 1950 with at least two touchdown passes and a passer rating of 100-or-higher in each of his first three career starts.

Became the first rookie in the Super Bowl era with at least two touchdown passes, one rushing touchdown and a passer rating of 125-or-higher in his first career start.

RB CHRISTIAN MCCAFFREY ranked third with 1,880 scrimmage yards (1,139 rushing, 741 receiving) and had 14 total touchdowns (eight rushing, five receiving, one passing).

Led all running backs in receiving yards (741) and ranked second with 85 receptions and is one of three running backs in NFL history with four career seasons of at least 80 receptions, along with Pro Football Hall of Famer MARSHALL FAULK and ALVIN KAMARA.

Has 442 receptions and surpassed **ROGER CRAIG** (434) for the most receptions by a running back in his first six seasons in NFL history.

Has 20 career games with at least eight receptions and became the third running back in the Super Bowl era with at least 20 such career games, joining **LARRY CENTERS** (21 games) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **MARSHALL FAULK** (21).

Has 27 career games with at least 50 rushing yards and 50 receiving yards, surpassing **TIKI BARBER** (23 games) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** (23) for the second-most such games all-time. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer **MARSHALL FAULK** (41 games) has more.

Has 16 career games with at least 75 receiving yards, tied with **KEITH BYARS** (16 games) for the third-most such games by a running back in the Super Bowl era. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer **MARSHALL FAULK** (23 games) and **RONNIE HARMON** (19) have more.

SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS

Became the sixth player in NFL history with at least 20 rushing touchdowns (38) and 20 touchdown receptions (22) in his first six seasons, joining AUSTIN EKELER, CHUCK FOREMAN, ALVIN KAMARA, Pro Football Hall of Famer LENNY MOORE and BRIAN WESTBROOK.

Has 11 career games with both a rushing and receiving touchdown, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **JIM BROWN** (11) for the fourth-most such games by a player in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famers **MARSHALL FAULK** (15 games) and **LENNY MOORE** (12) as well as **BRIAN WESTBROOK** (12).

In Week 8, became the fourth player with a touchdown pass, rushing touchdown and touchdown reception in a single game since 1970, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **WALTER PAYTON** (October 21, 1979) and **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** (October 16, 2005) as well as **DAVID PATTEN** (October 21, 2001).

TE GEORGE KITTLE recorded 765 receiving yards and became the fifth tight end in NFL history
with at least 500 receiving yards in each of his first six seasons, joining ROB GRONKOWSKI
(first 11 seasons), Pro Football Hall of Famer OZZIE NEWSOME (first eight), KEITH JACKSON
(first seven) and JEREMY SHOCKEY (first six).

Has 5,254 career receiving yards and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **KELLEN WINSLOW SR**. (5,176 receiving yards) and **TRAVIS KELCE** (5,236) for the third-most receiving yards by a tight end in his first six seasons in NFL history. Only **ROB GRONKOWSKI** (5,555) and **JIMMY GRAHAM** (5,357).

Ranked second among tight ends with career-high 11 touchdown receptions and had four games with two touchdown receptions, the most by a tight end in a season since 2015 (**TYLER EIFERT** and **JORDAN REED**).

In Weeks 15-18, had seven touchdown receptions, tied for the second-most by any player over the final four games of a season in the Super Bowl era, trailing only Pro Football Hall of Famer **CALVIN JOHNSON** (eight touchdown receptions in 2011).

- WR BRANDON AIYUK set career highs in receptions (78), receiving yards (1,015) and touchdown receptions (eight).
- WR DEEBO SAMUEL totaled 864 scrimmage yards (632 receiving, 232 rushing) and five touchdowns (three rushing, two receiving), his third-career season with at least three rushing touchdowns.

Since 2019, is only player with at least 3,000 receiving yards (3,230) and 750 rushing yards (782).

• DL **NICK BOSA** led the league with a career-high 18.5 sacks and ranked tied for second with 19 tackles for loss.

Became the fifth player since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic, to record at least 15 sacks in two of his first four NFL seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **REGGIE WHITE** (three seasons with at least 15 sacks), **RICHARD DENT** (two) and **ANDRE TIPPETT** (two) as well as **J.J. WATT** (two).

SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS

Joined Pro Football Hall of Famers **RICHARD DENT** and **ANDRE TIPPETT** as the only players under the age of 26 to register at least 15 sacks in consecutive seasons since 1982.

Bosa became the fourth player since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic, to record at least one sack in 13 games within a single season, joining **DEMARCUS WARE** (14 games in 2008), **JUSTIN HOUSTON** (13 in 2014) and **CHANDLER JONES** (13 in 2017).

Recorded a sack in 29 of his first 50 career games, tied for the third-most such games by a player in his first 50 games since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic. Only **VON MILLER** (32 games) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **REGGIE WHITE** (31) had more.

• LB **FRED WARNER** was one of two players (**JORDAN HICKS**) with at least 125 tackles (130) and 10 passes defensed (career-high 10).

Is one of two players (**BOBBY WAGNER**) with at least 115 tackles in each of the last five seasons.

SEATTLE SEAHAWKS

SEATTLE (9-8) qualified for the postseason for the fourth time in the past five seasons.

In Week 4, Seattle and Detroit combined for 93 points and 1,075 total yards of offense (Seattle – 555 yards; Detroit – 520 yards). It marked the second game in NFL history in which two teams combined for at least 90 points and 1,075 total yards of offense, joining Cincinnati at Cleveland in Week 2 of the 2007 season.

 QB GENO SMITH had career-highs in completions (franchise-record 399), passing yards (franchise-record 4,282), touchdown passes (30 – most among NFC quarterbacks), completion percentage (franchise-record 69.8) and passer rating (100.9 – fifth in NFL).

Led the NFL with 10 games with at least two touchdown passes and a passer rating of 100-or-higher.

Led the league with nine games with a 70-or-higher completion percentage.

Became the eighth player in NFL history and first since **ALEX SMITH** (2017) to record his first-career season with at least 4,000 passing yards in his 10th-career season or later.

Was selected to his first Pro Bowl in his 10th career season and became the first quarterback since **RICH GANNON** (1999) to earn his first Pro Bowl selection in Year 10 or later of his career.

 RB KENNETH WALKER led all rookies with 1,215 scrimmage yards, 1,050 rushing yards and nine rushing touchdowns.

Became the second Seattle rookie ever with at least 1,000 rushing yards, joining **CURT WARNER** (1,449 in 1983).

He recorded five games with at least 100 rushing yards, the most by all rookies and tied for fourth-most in the league.

• WR **DK METCALF** had career-high 90 receptions for 1,048 yards and six touchdowns, his second-career 1,000-yard season.

Became the fifth player since 1970 to record at least 900 receiving yards and five touchdown receptions in each of his first four seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer RANDY MOSS (first six seasons), A.J. GREEN (first five), JOEY GALLOWAY (first four) and MICHAEL THOMAS (first four).

WR TYLER LOCKETT had 84 catches for 1,033 yards and nine touchdowns and is the only
player with at least eight touchdown receptions in each of the past five seasons.

Metcalf and Lockett were one of two wide receiver duos with at least 80 receptions and 1,000 receiving yards, along with Philadelphia's **A.J. BROWN** and **DEVONTA SMITH**.

LB JORDYN BROOKS led the NFC and ranked fifth in the league with 161 tackles.

Since 2021, has 19 games with at least 10 tackles, tied for the second-most in the league.

• LB **UCHENNA NWOSU** (9.5 sacks and three forced fumbles) and LB **DARRELL TAYLOR** (9.5 sacks and four forced fumbles) were the only pair of teammates to each record at least nine

SEATTLE SEAHAWKS

sacks and three forced fumbles.

• CB **TARIQ WOOLEN** tied for the league lead with six interceptions, tied for second with three fumble recoveries and ranked tied for fourth with 16 passes defensed this season.

Became the first rookie since 2000 and first player since 2016 (MARCUS PETERS) with six interceptions and three fumble recoveries in a season.

From Weeks 3-6, became the third rookie since 2000 with an interception in four consecutive games, joining **JAIRUS BYRD** (five consecutive games in 2009) and **JOE HADEN** (four consecutive games in 2010).

In Weeks 5-6, became the first rookie since 1970 to record both an interception and opponent fumble recovery in consecutive games.

TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS

- **TAMPA BAY** (8-9) clinched the AFC South division title in back-to-back seasons for the first time in franchise history.
- QB TOM BRADY led the NFL with 490 completions, surpassing the mark he set last year (485) for the most completions in a season in NFL history

Led the NFC and ranked third in the NFL with 4,694 passing yards and ranked fifth in the NFC with 25 touchdowns.

Has 14 career seasons with at least 4,000 passing yards, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** for the most such seasons in NFL history.

Has 17 seasons with at least 25 touchdown passes, surpassing Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (16) for the most such seasons all-time.

Has 58 career game-winning drives and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **PEYTON MANNING** (54) for the most game-winning drives in NFL history.

Has 102,263 career passing yards, including the postseason, and became the first player in NFL history with 100,000 career passing yards.

Has 11 career games with at least 400 passing yards and three touchdown passes, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famers **PEYTON MANNING** (11 games) and **DAN MARINO** (11) for the second-most such games in NFL history. Only **DREW BREES** (12 games) has more.

Has 131 career games with at least 300 passing yards, including the postseason, tied with **DREW BREES** (131) for the most such games including the playoffs in NFL history.

Had 10 games with at least 30 completions this season, the most such games within a single season in NFL history.

From Weeks 13-17, became the first player in NFL history to complete at least 30 passes in five consecutive games.

In Week 10, led the Buccaneers to a win in the first regular-season game played in Germany and became the first quarterback to start a game in three different countries outside of the United States.

From Weeks 1-10, recorded 399 consecutive pass attempts without an interception, the second-most consecutive pass attempts without an interception in NFL history, trailing only **AARON RODGERS** in 2018 (402).

 RB LEONARD FOURNETTE recorded 1,191 scrimmage yards (668 rushing, 523 receiving) and six touchdowns (three rushing, three receiving).

Was one of three running backs with at least 600 rushing yards and 500 receiving yards, along with **AUSTIN EKELER** and **CHRISTIAN MCCAFFREY**.

Ranked third among running backs with 73 receptions, his second-career season with at least 70 receptions.

TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS

WR MIKE EVANS had 77 receptions for 1,124 yards and six touchdowns.

Became the first player in NFL history with at least 1,000 receiving yards in each of his first nine seasons.

Became the third player ever with at least 1,000 receiving yards in nine consecutive seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **JERRY RICE** (11 consecutive seasons from 1986-96) and **TIM BROWN** (nine consecutive seasons from 1993-2001).

Became the fifth player all-time with at least 10,000 receiving yards (10,425) and 80 touchdown receptions (81) in his first nine career seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **MARVIN HARRISON**, **CALVIN JOHNSON**, **RANDY MOSS** and **JERRY RICE**.

Became the sixth player in NFL history with at least 50 receptions in each of his first nine career seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer MARVIN HARRISON, ANQUAN BOLDIN, GARY CLARK, LARRY FITZGERALD and TORRY HOLT.

Has five career games with at least 180 receiving yards and two touchdown receptions, tied with **TYREEK HILL** (five games) for the most such games in NFL history

 WR CHRIS GODWIN recorded a career-high 104 receptions for 1,023 yards and three touchdowns and joined KEYSHAWN JOHNSON (106 receptions in 2001) as the only players in franchise history with 100 receptions in a season.

Had 14 games with at least five receptions, second-most in the NFL.

LB LAVONTE DAVID recorded his ninth-career season with at least 100 tackles (124), second-most among active players.

Recorded his ninth-career season with at least 10 tackles for loss, tied for the second-most among active players.

One of eight players to record at least 100 tackles, 10 tackles for loss and five passes defensed this season.

• LB **DEVIN WHITE** recorded 124 tackles, his third-consecutive season with at least 100 tackles.

Was one of four players with at least 100 tackles, five sacks (5.5) and five passes defensed (five) in 2022, along with **DEMARIO DAVIS**, **PATRICK QUEEN** and **BOBBY WAGNER**.

TENNESSEE TITANS

- **TENNESSEE** led the league in rushing defense (76.9 yards allowed per game).
- RB DERRICK HENRY ranked second with 1,538 rushing yards and tied for second with 13 rushing touchdowns.

Ranked second with 1,936 scrimmage yards, including a career-high 398 receiving yards.

Had nine games with at least 100 rushing yards, most in the NFL.

Has six career games with at least 200 rushing yards, tied with **ADRIAN PETERSON** (six) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **O.J. SIMPSON** (six) for the most such games in NFL history.

Has six career games with at least 200 rushing yards and two rushing touchdowns, the most such games all-time. The next closest players – Pro Football Hall of Famers **JIM BROWN**, **BARRY SANDERS** and **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** – each had three such career games.

Had 77 rushing touchdowns in his first 100 career games, the sixth-most rushing touchdowns by a player in his first 100 career games in the Super Bowl era. Only Pro Football Hall of Famers **EMMITT SMITH** (103 rushing touchdowns), **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** (102) and **ERIC DICKERSON** (80) as well as **SHAUN ALEXANDER** (91) and **ADRIAN PETERSON** (86) had more.

Became the fifth player in NFL history with at least 10 rushing touchdowns in five consecutive seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** (nine consecutive seasons from 2001-09), **ADRIAN PETERSON** (seven from 2007-13), **SHAUN ALEXANDER** (five from 2001-05) and **MICHAEL TURNER** (five from 2008-12).

In Week 8, joined **EDDIE GEORGE** (four consecutive games vs. Cleveland from 1999-2000) as the only players ever with at least two rushing touchdowns in four consecutive games against a single opponent with two rushing touchdowns against Houston. With 219 rushing yards in the game, he became the first player in league history to record at least 150 rushing yards in four consecutive games against a single opponent.

- WR **ROBERT WOODS** is one of two players with at least 500 receiving yards in each of the past 10 seasons, along with **DEANDRE HOPKINS**.
- S KEVIN BYARD was one of three players with at least 100 tackles (106) and four interceptions (four), along with GRANT DELPIT and JALEN PITRE.

Since 2017, ranks second with 27 interceptions and is the only player with at least four interceptions in five of the past six seasons.

 P RYAN STONEHOUSE led the league with 53.1 yards per punt and surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer SAMMY BAUGH (51.4 in 1940) for the highest punting average in a season in NFL history.

Had a 44.0 net yards per punt average, the highest net punting average by a rookie in a season since 1976.

WASHINGTON COMMANDERS

• RB **BRIAN ROBINSON** ranked fifth among rookies with 797 rushing yards.

Was one of four rookie running backs with three games of at least 100 scrimmage yards, along with **DAMEON PIERCE** (six), **KENNETH WALKER** (six) and **TYLER ALLGEIER** (five).

RB ANTONIO GIBSON had career-high 46 receptions along with 899 scrimmage yards (546 rushing, career-high 353 receiving) and five touchdowns (three rushing, two receiving).

Is one of three players who entered the NFL in 2020 with at least 3,000 scrimmage yards (3,272) and 25 scrimmage touchdowns (26), along with **JUSTIN JEFFERSON** and **JONATHAN TAYLOR**.

 WR TERRY MCLAURIN had 77 receptions for a career-high 1,191 receiving yards and five touchdowns.

Is one of seven players in NFL history with at least 50 receptions and 900 receiving yards in each of his first four seasons, joining MIKE EVANS, JOEY GALLOWAY, A.J. GREEN, DK METCALF. Pro Football Hall of Famer RANDY MOSS and MICHAEL THOMAS.

Is one of five wide receivers with at least 75 receptions and 1,000 receiving yards in each of the past three seasons, along with **DAVANTE ADAMS**, **STEFON DIGGS**, **TYREEK HILL** and **JUSTIN JEFFERSON**.

- WR **JAHAN DOTSON** ranked tied for first among rookies with seven touchdown receptions.
- DT JONATHAN ALLEN had 65 tackles, career-high 16 tackles for loss and 7.5 sacks.

Had five games with multiple tackles for loss, tied for the third-most in the NFL.

Is the only defensive lineman with at least 60 tackles in each of the last five seasons.

• DT **DARON PAYNE** recorded 64 tackles and set career highs with 18 tackles for loss and 11.5 sacks. His 18 tackles for loss were tied for the fourth-most this season.

Allen and Payne were one of two pairs of teammates to each record at least 15 tackles for loss, along with Carolina's **BRIAN BURNS** and **FRANKIE LUVU**.

DE MONTEZ SWEAT had 46 tackles, 14 tackles for loss and eight sacks this season.

With Allen, Payne and Sweat, **WASHINGTON** was the only team with three players each with at least 14 tackles for loss.

 CB KENDALL FULLER was one of two players (KYLE DUGGER) with two interception-return touchdowns.
