

Among the offensive skill position players available in the 2023 NFL Draft, there are many projected first round talents, including running back Bijan Robinson, wide receivers Jordan Addison, Jalin Hyatt, Zay Flowers, Quentin Johnston and Jaxon Smith-Njigba, and tight ends Dalton Kincaid, Michael Mayer and Darnell Washington.



A running back has been selected in the first round of seven of the past eight NFL Drafts (2015-21).

If Ohio State WR **JAXON SMITH-NJIGBA** is selected in the first round, he would become the 10th Buckeyes wide receiver selected in the first round of the NFL Draft since 1967. It would also mark the fourth time in the past five NFL Drafts that Ohio State has had an offensive player selected in the first round.

TCU WR **QUENTIN JOHNSTON** can become the third Horned Frogs wide receiver selected in the first round of the NFL Draft since 1967 and can become the first to be chosen with a top-20 selection.





If USC WR **JORDAN ADDISON** is selected in the first round, he would become the fifth Trojans wide receiver selected in the first round since 2000 and it would mark the second time in the common-draft era that USC had a first-round wide receiver in consecutive drafts (Curtis Conway - No. 7 in 1993; Johnnie Morton - No 21 in 1994).

Tennessee WR **JALIN HYATT** can become the fourth Volunteers wide receiver selected in the first round since 2000 and can become the first offensive player from Tennessee chosen with a first round pick since 2014 (T Ju'Wuan James - No. 19 overall).



Both Hyatt (2022) and Addison (2021) won the Fred Biletnikoff Award, presented to the most outstanding college football receiver. Each of the past three winners of the award were selected in the first round of the NFL Draft.

Tennessee T **DARNELL WRIGHT** can become the sixth Tennessee offensive lineman selected in the first round of the NFL Draft since 1967 and the first since Ja'Wuan James (No. 19 overall) in 2014.

In the past 15 NFL Drafts (2008-22), there have been nine occasions where a school has had both a quarterback and an offensive lineman selected in the first round of the same NFL Draft. Tennessee (Wright and QB Hendon Hooker), Florida (G O'Cyrus Torrence and QB Anthony Richardson) and Ohio State (Johnson, Jones and QB C.J. Stroud) look to join this group in 2023.



Georgia DL **JALEN CARTER** can become the seventh defensive player selected in the top 10 from Georgia since 1967. At least one defensive player from Georgia has been selected in the first round in four of the past five NFL Drafts.

Georgia has had 17 defensive players selected in the first round since 2000, tied with Alabama (17) for the third-most among colleges in that span. Only Ohio State (24) and Miami - FL (19) have more. Georgia had five defensive players selected in the first round of the 2022 NFL Draft, the most defensive players from one school selected in the first round of the same NFL Draft since 1967.

Texas Tech DE **TYREE WILSON** can become the second Red Raiders defensive lineman and sixth Texas Tech player overall to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft since 1967.

Georgia Tech DE **KEION WHITE** can become the fourth defensive player from Georgia Tech to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft since 1967 and the second defensive lineman, joining Derrick Morgan (No. 16 in 2010). The highest-selected defensive players from Georgia Tech are linebackers Keith Brooking (1998) and Marco Coleman (1992), who were both selected No. 12 overall.





Clemson DE **MYLES MURPHY** can become the sixth Tigers defensive lineman selected in the first round of the NFL Draft since 2000 and the first since Clelin Ferrell was selected No. 4 overall in 2019.

If lowa DE **LUKAS VAN NESS** is selected in the first round, he would become the fifth Hawkeyes defensive player selected in the first round since 1967 and the first since 2011 (Adrian Clayborn - No. 20 overall).
